Message from our Supreme President

The Supreme Physical Fitness Board held their 2021 annual meeting on January 16 via Zoom. The Board reviewed their functions and the projects they were able



to do in 2020. We all know 2020, the year of problems that was caused by the COVID-19 virus kept the Board from holding our annual fraternal activities. Not holding the Physical Fitness Board back, they kept

trying to keep the Slovak Catholic Sokol members engaged. The one issue the Board found that needs to be improved is getting their message and information out to the Society's leaders and members. With restrictions still in place and an uncertain future the Board continues to plan Sokol fraternal activities for 2021 with hopes that what they plan members will participate and enjoy.

To be informed, information is communicated via word, print and now electronically. For this to be successful the communication needs to be meaningful and sent to the audience it is meant to reach. The most important part of communicating is to be sure the recipient information, whether it is their address or e-mail address is correct. In the upcoming months all Assemblies, Wreaths and Groups should check their officer information to make sure it is correct. Then send your updated list to our Supreme Secretary, Scott T. Pogorelec. This will ensure all of our local and regional leaders are receiving current information and can be contacted by the Home Office and Supreme Officers.

The Falcon is the Slovak Catholic Sokol's monthly communication vehicle. It started out as a weekly newspaper, all in Slovak, and over the years became a monthly publication. There is one thing missing in the Falcon which is so important to our Society and that is hearing from our Assemblies, Wreaths, Groups and members. The Society's membership wants to hear from all of you. This is the way you share what is happening in your lodges and Groups and the accomplishments of your family. The Society has over 200 Wreaths and As-

semblies, 19 Groups and 27,000 plus members that all have a story to share with the membership. If we received an article from every Group, Assembly and Wreath at least once a year the membership would learn about what you did and what is happening in our Society. So, I ask all Groups, Assemblies and Wreaths to submit an article or two to inform the membership on what you are doing, have done or on your history. Share your good news to the rest of the membership and make the Falcon more exciting to read.

We will begin the 2021 Lenten season on February 17, Ash Wednesday. Most of the time we do not start thinking about Lent until Ash Wednesday and then we decide what to do. Today is the day to start planning on how you will live your forty days of Lent. In the past Lent was about giving something up, personal sacrifice, now it is more about changing our lives to help others. What you chose to do follow your plan. This year I heard Ashes will be sprinkled on our head instead of the making the sign of the cross on our foreheads. THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY LITURGICALLY SPEAKING

The month of February is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Family. Between the events which marked Christmas and the beginning of Christ's public life the Church has seen fit to recall the example of the Holy Family for the emulation of the Christian family.



The Feast of the Presentation (February 2) or Candlemas forms a fitting transition from Christmas to Easter. The small Christ-Child is still in His Mother's arms, but already she is offering Him in sacrifice.

This celebration harkens back to the Christmas mystery of Light except that now, Christ, the helpless babe, is "the Light of Revelation to the Gentiles who will save his people from their sins." Candles, symbolizing Christ our Light, will be carried in procession this day, as will be the Paschal candle during the Easter Vigil Liturgy.

"The Light of Revelation" shines more brightly with each successive Sunday of Ordinary Time, until its magnificence – exposing our sinfulness and need for conversion – propels us into the penitential Season of Lent.

From the Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments, Ash Wednesday will look a bit different this year for most of us due to the Covid-19 safety requirements. The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel", or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return".

The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him, **the Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything.**

We then plunge ourselves into anticipating the major exercises of Lent – fasting, prayer, almsgiving – laying our thoughts and prayers on the heart of our Mother Mary. She, who offered her Son in the temple and on the Cross, will teach us how to deny ourselves, take up our cross daily, and follow her Son.

The saints that we will focus on this month and try to imitate are St. Blaise (February 3), St. Agatha (February 5), St. Paul Miki & Companions (February 6), St. Jerome Emiliani and St. Josephine Bakhita (February 8), St. Scholastica (February 10), Our Lady of Lourdes (February 11), the Chair of St. Peter (February 22) and St. Polycarp (February 23).

The feasts of Sts. Cyril and Methodius (February 14) and St. Peter Damian (February 21), is superseded by the Sunday Liturgy. The feast of the Seven Founders of the Orders of Servites (February 17) is superseded by the Ash Wednesday Liturgy.

This year the first 16 days of February fall during the liturgical season known as Ordinary Time which is represented by the liturgical color green. Green, the symbol of hope, is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. The remaining days of February are the beginning of Lent.

The liturgical color changes to purple — a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart.

\$63,000 in S.C.S. Scholarship Grants Available to Eligible Members in 2021

We are pleased to announce that the Slovak Catholic Sokol will make available a total of \$63,000 in **scholarship grants** to eligible members in 2021. Previous recipients of Slovak Catholic Sokol scholarship grants may reapply for a 2021 grant; however, per



Convention mandate - a student may receive a maximum of two (2) Slovak Catholic Sokol scholarship grant awards in each category.

A total of 30 Slovak Catholic Sokol college grants of \$1,000 each, two Theodore and Mary Jane Rich Memorial Scholarships one for a male and female in the amount of \$2,000 each, two Emil Slavik Memorial Scholarships one for a male and female in the amount of \$2,000 each, one The Doctors' Lesko Medical

Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000, one Krista L. Glugosh Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000, one Yencha Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 and three Slovak Catholic Sokol (SCS) Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.

With one application you may apply for all college scholarship grants for which you are eligible. Note that only one grant per applicant will be awarded.

College scholarship eligibility requirements:

Slovak Catholic Sokol (a total of 30, \$1,000 grants will be awarded)

- Must have a minimum of \$3,000 permanent Life Insurance Coverage
- Must be a member of the Slovak Catholic Sokol for at least five years.
- Must have completed one semester of undergraduate studies as a FULL TIME student at an accredited college, university or professional school, or be enrolled in a graduate or professional degree program.
- Must have an accumulated grade point average of at least 2.5 or better
- One parent must be a Slovak Catholic Sokol member
- Essay- "How has being a member of the Slovak Catholic Sokol influenced my life?"

Theodore and Mary Jane Rich (one male and one female grant in the amount of \$2,000 will be awarded)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND
- One parent must be of Slovak Ancestry
- Must be majoring in medical curriculum

Emil Slavik (one male and one female grant in the amount of \$2,000 will be awarded)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND
- Both parents must be members of the Slovak Catholic Sokol
- Must be majoring in liberal arts, the sciences, pre-law, pre-medical or business curriculum.

The Doctors' Lesko Medical Memorial Scholarship (1 grant in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND
- Majoring in Nursing or Medical curriculum
- One parent must be of Slovak Ancestry

Krista L. Glugosh Memorial Scholarship (1 grant in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND
- Majoring in curriculum with a focus in computer graphics, design or layout

Yencha Scholarship (1 grant in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND
- Majoring in Liberal Arts Curriculum

Slovak Catholic Sokol Memorial Scholarship (3 grants in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded to the applicant that best exemplifies the spirit of volunteerism)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship
- Essay- "Describe the one volunteer experience that made the biggest personal impact on you- how/why".

SLOVAK CATHOLIC SOKOL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP – TIPS FOR SUCCESS

I just wanted to take a moment to highlight the recent changes made to the Slovak Catholic College Scholarship Program. We will continue to use a completely on-line process as we have had few issues with the process over the past several seasons. With the help of our technical webmaster, we have redesigned the application process and you should find it to be much more user friendly.

You will find the on-line application on our website at www.slovak-catholicsokol.org beginning December 1, 2020.

To be best prepared for this process a successful applicant should:

- Review the application on-line for required content and gather prior to beginning to complete the form
- Be prepared to attach both your essay (in PDF or Word format) and a color head and shoulders picture of yourself (in .jpeg format).

Please note, you may want to print a copy for your records prior to submitting. All applicants will receive automatic confirmation that their e-mail has been received.

It really isn't that difficult to qualify for one of our many college scholarships. With now five years of the new College Scholarship Application process behind us, it is clear that there are a few ways to assure that your application will be reviewed.

1. Answer all questions on the application.

For example- if something does not apply to you- say N/A. If you are fully independent from your parents- as in, you are not claimed by them on their tax return, you should indicate that in the space asking for total parent income. Leaving this blank does not tell the whole story.

2. Include all requirements for the application- i.e. photo; transcript; essay

Start the process for requesting your transcript NOW. I have found that sometimes this is the hold up for some applicants.

- **Transcripts-** please note that "official transcript" means that you have requested it from your University or College and that it has been sent directly to me in a **sealed envelope**. We have not been as strict in the past on this issue, but began holding each applicant to this requirement last season and will continue to do so moving forward.

3. Submit all required elements prior to the deadline.

The application is clear and I just want to prevent a waste of your time and energy.

Failure to include/complete any of the above items will result in the application being disqualified. To be honest, it is not easy for our committee when we need to disqualify applicants for simple yet important missing requirements.

Lastly, apply for all college scholarships for which you qualify in order to give yourself the best chance at receiving something. There were several applicants who limited themselves to a particular scholarship. Competition was fierce for the larger \$ scholarships, but there seems to be more opportunity with the other scholarship offerings.

Not every applicant receives a scholarship every time they apply. If you have not received one in the past, I encourage you to apply again this year. Before submitting your application- take some time to review the bullet points above in order to assure that your application will be included for consideration.

MINUTES OF THE SUPREME BOARD OF DIRECTORS QUARTERLY MEETING

After a lengthy discussion, President Horvath entertained a motion to postpone the 50th International Slet until July 2022, so moved by Supreme Treasurer, James F. Knis, seconded by Supreme Chaplain, Rev. Andrew S. Hvozdic. **Approved**

President Horvath asked for a motion to accept the Supreme Physical Fitness Board Report, so moved by Supreme Treasurer, James F. Knis, seconded by Chairperson of the Supreme Auditors, James G. Jerek. **Approved**

Brother President began discussion regarding the **declaration of a dividend** for the year 2020 to be distributed during 2021. The 2019 dividend declaration issued in 2020 was \$50,000.00.

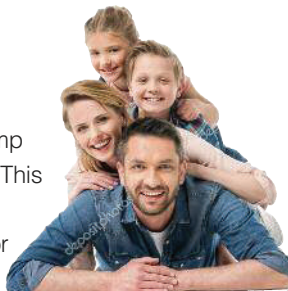
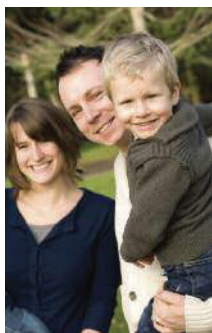

EMILIA KOVACOVA DIES**

Former Slovakia's first lady Emilia Kovacova, the wife of the country's first president Michal Kovac (1993-98), died on New Year's Eve, one month before her 90th birthday. Michal Kovac died in October 2016. He was 86 years old.

EX-POLICE CHIEF MILAN LUCANSKY DIES IN HOSPITAL

Former police chief Milan Lucansky has died in a hospital following his suicide attempt in a detention cell on Tuesday, December 29.

Following his suicide attempt, Lucansky was taken to hospital in a critical state. Prison and Judicial Guards general director Milan Ivan stepped down in response. Justice Minister Maria Kolikova announced that she'll form a large commission to investigate the incident that will be open to representatives of the opposition, the president, public ombudswoman and European institutions.

Former police chief Milan Lucansky, was in custody since the beginning of December over corruption-related charges.

**GOV'T ALLOCATES 1,000 SOLDIERS
TO HELP HEALTH STAFF DEAL WITH PANDEMIC**

Up to 1,000 soldiers will be available every day to provide the necessary medical and sanitary support to health-care facilities. The Government approved the assistance for a long period, with the measure being provisionally valid until the end of June 2021.

"The unfavourable developments in the coronavirus-related situation in Slovakia requires the further engagement of the armed forces in order to support the country's health-care sector," stated the draft submitters.

In line with the approved resolution, soldiers should provide necessary medical and sanitary support under the supervision of skilled medical staff and after being trained at an appropriate health-care facility. Further details regarding the implementation of the government resolution (i.e. location, time, number of soldiers, etc.) will be agreed by the Health and Defence Ministries.

**PG ZILINKA DECIDES TO TEMPORARILY SUSPEND
PROSECUTOR KATARINA K.**

Prosecutor-General (PG) Maros Zilinka on Thursday (January 7) decided to temporarily suspend prosecutor of the Regional Prosecutor's Office in Bratislava Katarina K., who is being criminally prosecuted by a National Crime Agency (NAKA) investigator for money laundering in the form of com-

plicity, TASR has learnt from PG Office spokesperson Jana Tokolyova.

"I believe that the prosecution service can be a credible institution only if respect for the law is equally required from all of us," said Zilinka. The charges against Katarina K. were pressed and her criminal prosecution launched on January 4.

Katarina K. in early December 2020 filed a complaint concerning the alleged unlawful conduct by Special Prosecution Office's (USP) prosecutors Ondrej Repa and Michal Surek in relation to her husband Marian K., a NAKA investigator who was remanded in custody as part of NAKA's Operation Judas. The two allegedly forced him to confess to his crimes and co-operate with the police. They allegedly threatened to disgrace both him and his wife, claiming that he'll be sent to prison if he doesn't comply.

Opposition Smer-SD party chairman Robert Fico on December 4 announced he has filed a criminal complaint against Repa and Surek for committing several crimes. He asked the acting special prosecutor to suspend them immediately. The Prosecutor's Council, however, labelled Fico's claims as grossly misleading and untrue, being a part of a discrediting campaign against the prosecutors.

Subsequently, 59 prosecutors have objected via a joint declaration against statements made by Fico. The prosecutors warned that attacks by lawmakers on representatives of the law-enforcement authorities directly interfere with their activities, noting that they view this as an attempt to influence their actions.

**RECOVERY OF TOURISM SECTOR
WILL DEPEND ON RESTRICTIONS**

The recovery of the tourism sector will depend on whether Slovakia will still be struggling with restrictions this year or it will be possible to travel and take recreation in a normal way, Transport Minister Andrej Dolezal has told TASR.

Dolezal said he personally puts high hopes in vaccination. "I hope the situation will only improve from now on so that we can live, work and travel normally, which will help the whole economy the most," he stressed.

The Transport Ministry already started to pay the money to help entrepreneurs engaged in the travel industry hit by the coronavirus pandemic. The ministry launched the assistance scheme on December 15. The assistance should continue until the end of 2021.

"This help compensates their fixed costs. It means compensation of losses that tourism facilities suffered on revenues compared to 2019," said the ministry's state secretary Katarina Brunckova, adding that the aid will be paid retroactively as well. She said that the assistance is directly dependent on the decline in revenues, ranging between 2 and 10 percent of them. The assistance scheme is targeted at the entire tourism sector, including restaurants, sports facilities, ski resorts, travel agencies and accommodation facilities.

PG ZILINKA ORDERS EXAMINATION OF ANTIGEN TEST PURCHASE

Prosecutor-General (PG) Maros Zilinka has ordered an examination of the purchase of one million antigen tests of the Ra-PiGen brand by the State Material Reserves Administration at a cost of 3.9 million, PG's Office spokesperson Jana Tokolyova told TASR on January 11.

"The PG did so based on his official duties after hearing Prime Minister Igor Matovic's (OLaNO) serious statements on Slovak Radio's Saturday Dialogues on January 9, when he spoke about the alleged poor quality of purchased tests that will catch no one [who is COVID-19 positive], about 'shoddy goods' that he would never use to test even a dog, about deception and hocus-pocus on 250,000 tested people and about damages amounting to 3.9 million," said Tokolyova.

"I will ask my colleague [Economy Minister] Richard Sulik (Freedom and Solidarity/SaS) about those damages now," said Matovic on Slovak Radio regarding the antigen tests, which were procured by Sulik. "We gave people the false impression that they aren't ill," stated Matovic.

Matovic blames Sulik for the lack of antigen tests in Slovakia and so wants to take the power to procure tests out of the minister's hands and give it to some other Cabinet member. "We must take this power away from Sulik, as he would purchase tests as late as in August," claimed Matovic.

MATOVIC ANNOUNCES PLAN TO CARRY OUT MASS TESTING ON WEEKLY BASIS

Prime Minister Igor Matovic announced on January 11 after a session of the Government that dealt with the current situation surrounding the coronavirus pandemic that there'll be further rounds of mass testing for COVID-19 in the country that will take place on a weekly basis, starting as of next weekend at latest.

According to the premier, the weekly testing will stay in place as long as the basic reproduction number of the virus exceeds 0.5. Representatives of individual parties and institutions that will carry out the upcoming rounds of mass testing will meet already on Monday evening. Matovic explained that their aim is to prepare the operation so that it goes as seamlessly as possible and to prevent the mistakes from the first rounds of mass testing that took place in the autumn. The first week of renewed mass testing will concern all districts in the country.

Matovic stated that at the current pace, the spreading of the virus won't significantly change for the better until the population is vaccinated despite the current lockdown. He mentioned in this regard the new, more aggressive coronavirus variant that has started to spread from southeastern England and its impact on the reproduction number of the virus and its further spread.

Speaking on a related note, Matovic once again criticised how the Economy Ministry proceeded in procuring antigen tests in recent weeks. According to the premier, the fact that the ministry failed to purchase a sufficient number of tests could result in the deaths of 4,300 people and cause economic damage amounting to 1 billion. At the same time, Matovic claimed that he'll remove the task of procuring antigen tests from the Economy Ministry.

SLOVAK DESIGNER WINS TOP PRIZE FOR OCEAN STATION PROTOTYPE THAT REMOVES PLASTIC FROM THE SEA



A prototype ocean cleaning facility by Slovak designer Lenka Petraková has scooped the highest award in an architectural competition for projects posing creative solutions to environmental challenges.

Called The 8th Continent, the floating station designed to solve one of the world's most pressing pollution problems: ocean plastic waste. Marine debris currently covers a surface of approximately 1.6 million square metres in the North Pacific — known as the Great Pacific garbage patch — which, as Petraková suggests, could be considered the world's eighth continent.

The 8th Continent was awarded the 2020 Grand Prix Award for Architecture and Innovation of the Sea from Foundation Jacques Rougerie, a French institute that awards visionary projects that encourage sustainable collaborations between scientists and designers.

Petraková's model consists of interconnected petal-shaped buildings which stand on tentacle-like platforms, and all work together to collect plastic debris from the water surface and transform it into recyclable material. The prototype also features a research and education centre that studies and showcases marine environments, a greenhouse where plants are grown using hydroponic cultivation — a method for growing plants without soil just using water — and living facilities for the station's researchers.

Petraková prototype is conceptualised to be self-sufficient and both adapt and benefit from the ocean's environment. The buildings are designed to allow wind to pass through the station, making it more resistant to strong ocean winds, collect water for irrigation, and harness tidal and solar energy.

"Although it is an unbuilt project, as Jules Verne said, anything one man can imagine, another man can make real," says Petraková. "And I believe today is the time to imagine a cleaner, environmentally more sustainable future and ways to achieve it with technical, architectural and artistic creations, to allow us to build them for ours and the world's better tomorrows."

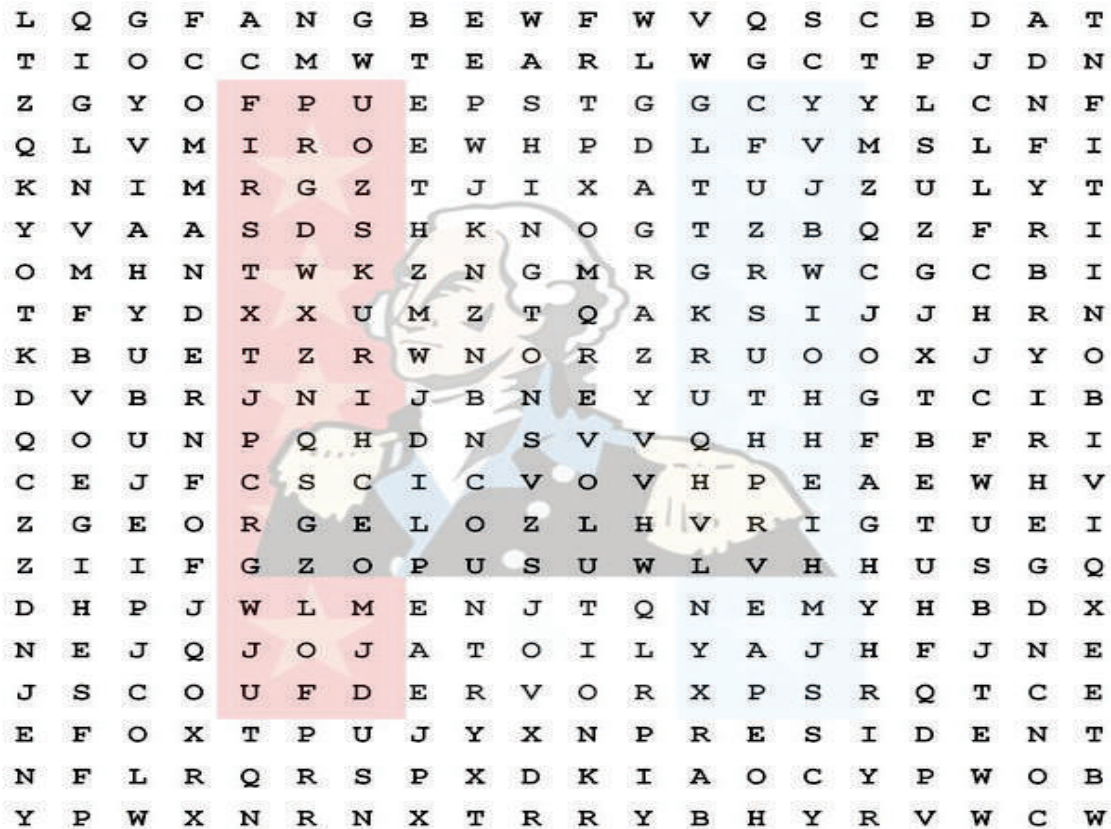

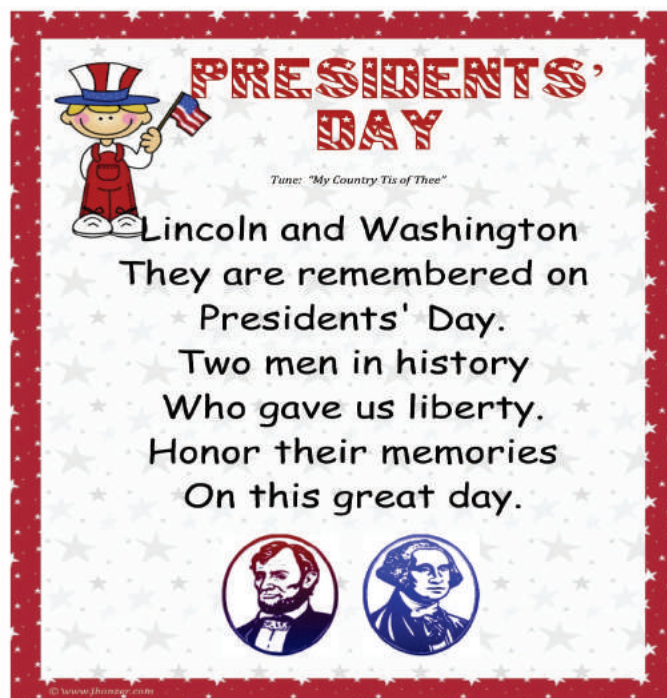

INSTALLATION OF BISHOP-ELECT LARRY KULICK SET FOR FEB.11 IN GREENSBURG, PA

When he received a recent call from the Vatican representative to the United States, Monsignor Larry J. Kulick thought he might be receiving an update on the search for a new leader of the Diocese of Greensburg, PA.

Msgr. Kulick had been serving as administrator of the diocese since September 2020, when previous Bishop Edward Malesic became Bishop of Cleveland, Oh.

What Msgr. Kulick didn't expect was that he would get the assignment himself - that Pope Francis had named him the sixth Bishop of Greensburg. It was the ecclesiastical equivalent of offering a permanent job to the temp.

"What I heard so clearly was an invitation to serve" and as a "tremendous bonus and blessing, to continue to serve in the Diocese of Greensburg," he said at a recent news conference at Christ Our Shepherd Center, a church center in Greensburg, PA.



While bishops are typically appointed from outside of a diocese, it's not rare to have a native of that diocese become its bishop. The most recent two bishops of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, David A. Zubik and Donald Wuerl, grew up and became priests in that diocese, but returned home only after each served as bishop in another diocese.

But Msgr. Kulick said it's more unusual for a priest to be appointed directly from within a diocese and for a temporary administrator to find his caretaker role turned into a permanent one. He said it may reflect Pope Francis' emphasis on pastoral leaders - "to have a bishop being named who is called to shepherd in the diocese they were raised and served in."

Msgr. Kulick, 54 will be ordained and installed as bishop on February 11 at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, by the metropolitan Archbishop of Philadelphia, Nelson Perez.

This is the diocese in which I was born, baptized, received all of my sacraments, was ordained and served as a priest for 28 years," he said. "I do not underestimate this privilege, nor do I take it lightly. I promise our Holy Father and each of you that I will strive to....be the best shepherd I can."

A native of Leechburg, PA, he grew up at the former St. Martha Parish, an ethnic Slovak congregation where he developed his affinity for Slovak religious and cultural traditions. He graduated from St. Joseph High School in the Natrona Heights section of Harrison, St. Vincent College and St. Vincent Seminary.

Msgr. Kulick is a canon lawyer and has served as the pastor at St. James Church in New Alexandria since 2012. He's a classic-car enthusiast, with an affinity for Pontiacs, which he has brought to the parish's annual car cruises.

The term Monsignor is an honorific title usually given to a priest who has performed an important service or holds an important position.

He will be the sixth bishop to head the diocese. The first five came from other dioceses in Pennsylvania. The Rev. Thomas Reese, a Religious News Service columnist, said appointments such as his have some precedent. "A diocesan administrator is normally someone who would be considered a candidate," said Father Reese, a priest and author of books on the Catholic hierarchy.

The Greensburg Diocese includes 78 parishes in Armstrong, Fayette, Indiana and Westmoreland counties.

It has 126,649 Catholics, according to the 2020 Official Catholic Directory. Like many Catholic dioceses in the region, its ranks of members have been aging and decreasing amid demographic shifts and growing secularization. The Church has lost 14% of members in the past five years and nearly a third in the past 20 years.

For those who have been active in their parishes, he appealed to them to continue to be so and to expand their work where they can.

He apologized to victims of sexual abuse, saying he has met "face to face" with survivors and would do what he could to help them and prevent future abuse.

The diocese was one of six named in a 2018 statewide grand jury report which said 20 of its priests had been accused since the diocese's creation in 1951. The diocese has paid \$5.9 million from a compensation fund to 72 survivors.

He acknowledged the impact of the coronavirus.

"Mass attendance is 30 to 40% of pre-pandemic levels," he said, and impacting financial giving. "But I want you to know that even during the pandemic, God's work continues."

He applauded Catholics' responses to the pandemic in mobilizing to aid the needy and providing for ministry remotely and in person using safety precautions. He also pledged to continue the diocese's response to the opioid epidemic in the region, which was a priority of Bishop Malesic's work.

Religious leaders from the region applauded his appointment.

"He has been a very good friend to our congregation," said Sister Catherine Meinert, provincial superior of the Greensburg-based Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill. "Our prayers will be with him as he assumes leadership of our diocese."

Msgr. Raymond Riffle, rector of Blessed Sacrament Cathedral and director of Catholic Charities for the diocese, has known Msgr. Kulick since the early 1990's, when they served at the same parish.

"When....he is talking with you, that's where his attention is, and you definitely know that he is interested in what you have to say and that it is important that he hear it," said Msgr. Riffle. "He has always evidenced that desire to be connected to the people."

"Bishop-elect Kulick is an amazing pastor and an outstanding administrator, said Bishop David A. Zubik in a statement. "I have known him since he was a seminary student. He was impressive then and even more so now."

The Rev. Liddy Barlow, executive minister for Christian Associates of Southwest Pennsylvania, an ecumenical organization of Catholic, Orthodox and Protestant denominations, said Msgr. Kulick has "demonstrated a strong interest in ecumenism and a warm, pastoral heart."

Archabbot Martin de Pores Bartel of St. Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, PA noted that Msgr. Kulick studied at its affiliated college and seminary. "We are so pleased that 'one of our own' will take the helm as our chief shepherd," he said in a statement. "We look forward to our continued partnership with him."

Bishop-elect Kulick is our long-time member of the Slovak Catholic Sokol in Wreath 15. He also enjoys membership in the First Catholic Slovak Union and the First Catholic Slovak Ladies Association and supports the work of the Slovak Catholic Federation.

Our congratulations and fraternal best wishes go out to Bishop-elect Kulick, who so beautifully mirrors our Cyrilo-Methodian heritage of faith and heritage

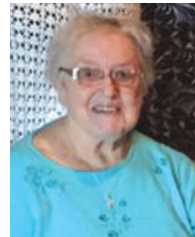

KRÁTKE SPRÁVY ZO SLOVENSKA

Emília Kováčová, manželka exprezidenta Michala Kováča, ktorú zomrel v roku 2016, skonala vo veku nedožitých 90 rokov 31. decembra minulého roka.

Nepriaznivý vývoj krízovej situácie súvisiacej so šírením ochorenia COVID-19 na území SR si vyžaduje ďalšie zapojenie príslušníkov Ozbrojených síl SR na podporu v oblasti zdravotníctva. Príslušníci Ozbrojených síl vykonávajú potrebnú zdravotnícku a sanitárnu podporu pod dohľadom odborného zdravotníckeho personálu a po zaškolení. Zdravotníkom pomáha tisíc vojakov.

Bývalý policajný prezident Milan Lučanský zomrel 30. decembra po tom, ako sa deň predtým pokúsil o samovraždu v prešovskej väznici v Pezinku kde bol umiestnený na začiatku decembra minulého roku. Exšéf polície čelil obvineniu z prijímania úplatkov za to, že bude kryť aktivity mafiánskej skupiny Takáčovcov. Len v rokoch 2018 a 2019 takto podľa vyšetrovateľov získal viac ako pol milióna eur.

Ministerstvá určené ako subjekty hospodárskej mobilizácie majú vykonať opatrenia na zabezpečenie činnosti určených karanténnych zariadení alebo na zabezpečenie prednostnej výroby určených zdravotníckych pomôcok. Rozhodla o tom vo štvrtok 7. januára vláda schválením doplnenia vládneho nariadenia na vykonanie niektorých opatrení hospodárskej mobilizácie v súvislosti s vyhlásením núdzového stavu na zabezpečenie riešenia druhej vlny koronavírusu COVID-19. Vláda nariadila ústredným orgánom a okresným úradom vykonať opatrenia v oblasti organizácie výroby a organizácie služieb na zabezpečenie podporných služieb pre prevádzku karanténnych zariadení a na podporu činnosti orgánov krízového riadenia, záchranných zložiek Integrovaného záchranného systému, ako aj na iné strategické účely.

Slovenskú poštu čakajú v tomto roku zásadné reformy. Prvým krokom bude úprava organizačnej štruktúry a pracovných miest. V prvej fáze sa rušenie pracovných miest alebo zmena dohodnutých pracovných podmienok dotkne približne 1500 zamestnancov pošty, zrušených bude 756 nadbytočných pracovných miest. Slovenská pošta v súčasnosti zamestnáva 12 894 zamestnancov s výkonom práce vo všetkých častiach Slovenska.

Slovensku hrozí, že do konca januára môže mať okolo 5-tisíc obetí ochorenia COVID-19, pričom v apríli by mŕtvych mohlo byť 10-tisíc až 15-tisíc,“ upozornil v rozhovore pre TV Pravda analytik globálnych trendov a rizík Juraj Mesík.

Na Slovensku v roku 2020 bolo celkovo zaregistrovaných 82 676 nových vozidiel. Celkový trh s uvedenými vozidlami tak poklesol o takmer 25% oproti roku 2019. Napriek zložitej situácii spôsobenej koronavírusovou pandémiou dokázala značka Toyota zvýšiť predaje v porovnaní s rokom 2019. Dosiahla celkovo 5 771 zaregistrovaných vozidiel a oproti roku 2019 vzrástla o 2,6 %. Japonskej značke sa po prvýkrát v histórii podarilo preraziť medzi prvých 5 značiek a so 7% trhovým podielom obsadila práve 5. miesto na trhu. Mesiac december pritom zakončila na celkovom 3. mieste s celkovo 692 novými zaregistrovanými vozidlami. Toyota má tak za sebou najúspešnejší rok na slovenskom trhu.

**ŤAŽKÁ MECHANIZOVANÁ BRIGÁDA
SA ONESKORÍ**

Termín ukončenia budovania ťažkej mechanizovanej brigády sa oneskorí. Namiesto roku 2018 tak bude k dispozícii až v roku 2032. Pretrvávajúcim nedostatkom je napríklad nízka naplnenosť Ozbrojených síl (OS) SR.

Vyplyva to z materiálu Ministerstva obrany (MO) SR, v ktorom informuje o procese a výsledkoch hodnotenia obranných plánov SR v rámci procesu obranného plánovania Organizácie Severoatlantickej zmluvy (NDPP).

Pozitívne NATO hodnotí postupné zvyšovanie obranných výdavkov, predpokladané splnenie všetkých kvantitatívnych cieľov z oblasti síl pre špeciálne operácie, ale aj podstatné zvýšenie úrovne civilnej pripravenosti.

SR by mala splniť aj väčšinu cieľov spôsobilostí z oblasti vzdušných síl. V porovnaní s minulosťou sa zmiernilo hodnotenie obstarania lietadiel F-16.

“SR totiž počas rokovaní k zneniu správy zdôraznila, že nové viacúčelové lietadlá F-16 budú v budúcnosti využité na plnenie pridelených cieľov spôsobilostí a boli zároveň deklarované do Iniciatívy pripravenosti NATO,” vysvetľuje MO SR.

Pokrok v oblasti podporných jednotiek zhodnotilo NATO napriek predstaveným projektom na rozvoj komunikačných a informačných systémov ako nedostatočný.

Hlavným nedostatkom je zastaranosť a slabá interoperabilita systémov využívaných v OS SR,“ konštatuje správa. Dlhodobým problémom je podľa NATO aj nedostatok zdravotníckeho personálu. Oceňuje však postupné posilňovanie zdravotníckych spôsobilostí.

SR plne naplňa kvantitatívne ciele v oblasti stabilizácie a rekonštrukcie. Z dôvodu limitovaných personálnych kapacít a výcvikových príležitostí však nedisponuje kompletnou požadovanou expertízou. NATO z tohto dôvodu odporúča, aby SR poskytovala svojmu personálu viac príležitostí na výcvik a rozvoj.

Nízku naplnenosť OS SR zaznamenala správa predovšetkým v oblasti zdravotníckeho personálu a pri IT špecialistoch. Pretrvávajúcim problémom je aj nízky počet osôb zaradených do aktívnych záloh.

Pozitívne sú hodnotené príspevky SR do operácií a misií a zapojenie sa do posilnenej predsunutej prítomnosti NATO (eFP) a Iniciatívy pripravenosti NATO.

Pravidelný, dvojročný proces hodnotenia obranných plánov členských krajín NDPP v rámci procesu obranného plánovania NATO sa uskutočnil v rokoch 2019 a 2020. NATO je aktuálne v procese pridelenia nových cieľov spôsobilostí. Ich schválenie sa očakáva v októbri 2021.

AT&T NA SLOVENSKU IDE PREPÚŠŤAŤ

Po firme Johnson Controls k prepúšťaniu pristupuje aj spoločnosť AT&T Global Network Services Slovakia, ktorá je súčasťou amerického telekomunikačného giganta. Vedenie AT&T rozhodlo znižovať stavy personálu na Slovensku. O prácu by tak malo prísť zhruba 440 ľudí. Približne 150 ľudí dostalo výpoveď v Košiciach.

Firma AT&T prišla na Slovensku v roku 2002. Postupne tam otvorila štyri centrá zamerané na zákaznícku podporu. Tri z nich sú v Bratislave a jedno v Košiciach. V najlepších časoch firma zamestnávala u nás vyše 3100 pracovníkov.



POMOCNÍCI V BOJI PROTI VÍRUSOM



V súčasnom období plnom nepríjemných viróz je dôležitá prevencia. Zdravý organizmus pomôže zvládnuť chrípku či prechladnutie.

Vitamíny sú veľmi dôležité pre náš organizmus. Vitamíny organické zlúčeniny, ktoré ľudský organizmus produkuje v relatívne nízkych množstvách. Je vhodné spomenúť aj to, akým spôsobom by sme mali vitamíny prijímať. Častou otázkou je, či je vhodné vitamíny prijímať v doplnkoch stravy, alebo by sme mali uprednostniť prirodzený prísun v potrave. Pravda je niekde uprostred. Vplyvom kvality pôdy, vody a ovzdušia dnes nedokážeme vyprodukovať potraviny s takým obsahom vitamínov, ako sme v ovocí či zelenine našli v minulosti. Mnohé výskumy dokazujú, že vitamín C prijatý z doplnkov výživy má totožný účinok ako prírodný. Neplatí to však pre všetky typy vitamínov.

V zdravej životospráve je prirodzenejšie konzumovať dostatok ovocia a zeleniny. Predovšetkým potraviny obsahujúce vitamíny rozpustné v tukoch – avokádo, orechy, vajcia atď. – prirodzene obsahujú aj tuky, vďaka ktorým sú spomenuté vitamíny lepšie rozpustné.

Medzi jedlá by sme v boji proti viróze mali zaradiť osvedčený recept našich starých rodičov - hydínový vývar so zeleninou. Nielen že zahreje a zabráni dehydratácii, navyše hydínové mäso sa pýši obsahom aminokyselín, ktoré sú dobrými pomocníkmi pri uvoľňovaní hlienu v dutinách aj v pľúcach.

Zázvor je nesmierne účinný nielen pri prevencii, ale aj pri liečbe samotnej. Je bohatým zdrojom vitamínov, zlepšuje trávenie, podporuje tvorbu žalúdočnej šťavy a má upokojujúce účinky. V spojení s medom je ideálnou kombináciou, práve vďaka jeho protizápalovým účinkom.

Cesnak je prírodným antibiotikom s protizápalovými účinkami. Protizápalové účinky ešte zvýšite kombináciou cesnaku a medu, napríklad v podobe cesnakovej pasty s medom. Ideálne je konzumovať cesnak čerstvý, ak ho vaše trávenie znesie.

Upchatému nosu a boľavým dutinám pikantné jedlá. Cesnak, chren, čili paprička a štiplavé omáčky. Pridajte si ich do jedla viac ako zvyčajne a výsledky sú zaručené. Ak máte problém so žalúdkom, pikantné jedlá konzumujte s mierou.

Zvýšený príjem vitamínu C je v ochrane pred virózami dôležitý. Špeciálne u fajčiarov, pretože fajčenie oslabuje imunitu a vitamín C z tela vo vyššej miere odbúrava. Tento základný „protichrípkový“ vitamín sa nachádza okrem citrusov aj v zemiakoch, zelenej paprike, jahodách či petržlenovej vňati.

Vyhýbajte sa konzumácii tučných alebo sladkých jedál, nepravidelnému stravovaciemu režimu. Všetky tieto faktory ľudský organizmus oslabujú a zvyšujú riziko nákazy. Dodržiavajte pitný režim, obmedzujte príjem kofeínu a doprajte si hodne spánku.

V boji proti chrípke, prechladnutiu či vírusovým ochoreniam teda nepomôžu len sporadicky zaradené vyššie uvedené potraviny či pokrmy, ale aj správne životospráva.

Na stavbe sa podieľalo celkovo 18 sochárov a 12 pomocníkov, uviedol Bakoš. Celý dóm je umiestnený v kupole s priemerom 25 metrov.
