

Thoughts from our Supreme Chaplain, Rev. Andrew S. Hvozdovic WHY JUNE IS DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS?

In popular piety, each month of the year has a corre sponding spiritual theme that focuses on

various aspects of the Christian faith.



June has become known as the Month of the Sacred Heart since the feast of the Sacred Heart is celebrated each year during it.

It all started when **St. Margaret Mary Alacoque** received private revelations from Jesus

Christ.

Jesus spoke to her on June 16, 1675, and asked her specifically to promote a feast that honored his Sacred Heart.

"I ask of you that the Friday after the Octave of Corpus Christi, this year being the 16th of June, be set apart for a special Feast to honor My Heart, by communicating on that day, and making reparation to It by a solemn act, in order to make amends for the indignities which It has received during the time It has been exposed on the altars. I promise you that My Heart shall expand Itself to shed in abundance the influence of Its Divine Love upon those who shall thus honor It and cause It to be honored."

Understood in the light of the Scriptures, the term "Sacred Heart of Jesus" denotes the entire mystery of Christ, the totality of his being, and his person considered in its most intimate essential: Son of God, uncreated wisdom; infinite charity, principal of the salvation and sanctification of mankind. The "Sacred Heart" is Christ, the Word Incarnate, Savior, intrinsically containing, in the Spirit, an infinite divine-human love for the Father and for his brothers.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is a wonderful historical expression of the Church's piety for Christ, her Spouse and Lord: it calls for a fundamental attitude of conversion and reparation, of love and gratitude, apostolic commitment and dedication to Christ and his saving work.

The precise date fluctuates each year, as it is determined by the celebration of Easter.

It took until 1856 for the feast of the Sacred Heart to be officially celebrated by the universal Church, and ever since then the month of June has been focused on devotion to the Heart of Jesus and his divine love for humanity.

AS PER OUR ORGANIZATION'S BYLAWS

DONATION REQUESTS FOR CONSIDERATION AT THE 34TH QUADRENNIAL CONVENTION

In order to insure that our members and delegates to our upcoming 34th Quadrennial Convention, scheduled for August 5 - August 8, 2023 in Scranton, PA, understand the procedure for donation requests at the Convention, I refer to page 15, Section 2.2(c) of our Bylaws. This section states: "The Petitions and Donations Committee shall consist of the Supreme Chaplain, Supreme President, and Supreme Secretary. Donations shall be limited to a maximum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to any one church, religious organization, social or cultural association, with a total donation limit of Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00).

Petitions and requests for donations must be submitted in writing and mailed to my attention at the Home Office, 205 Madison St., P.O. Box 899, Passaic, NJ 07055 no later than one (1) month prior to the Convention. No Faxed copies or E-mails will be accepted. This year's deadline for submitting all petitions and donation requests is Wednesday, July 5, 2023. No petition or donation request will be accepted from the Convention floor. The Committee shall submit a written report to the Convention.

I hope that all members and delegates fully understand our Bylaws related to petitions and donations. Our Bylaws clearly state our official policy and therefore serve as our guide in all our Convention deliberations and decisions. I bring this important issue to your attention so that we all have sufficient time to submit any petition or donation request to be considered by the Committee and delegates of the 34th Quadrennial Convention. I appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this important matter.

The double occupancy full golf package is \$375 at the Marriott Courtyard or \$365 at the Holiday Inn. The single occupancy is \$535 at the Marriott Courtyard or \$515 at the Holiday Inn. The golf package includes the tournament entry fee and prize money, a practice round on Friday and two full tournament rounds on Saturday and Sunday including cart, two nights lodging, with breakfast at the Marriott Courtyard Hotel. The full golf package also includes Friday night hospitality and Saturday dinner.

For our members who may not require the lodging and meal package, there is a golf only package for \$190.00, which includes a practice round and hospitality on Friday and two full tournament rounds of golf on Saturday and Sunday, entry fee and tournament expense fee. The double occupancy non-golf weekend package rate is \$160 at the Marriott Courtyard Hotel which includes lodging and breakfast and \$150 at the Holiday Inn.

The Monument Reserve of Popular Architecture in the central Slovakia commune ŠPANIA DOLINA consists of a unique set of miner houses built of wood and stones. The former mining village is undoubtedly one of the most beautiful in Slovakia. Copper and silver ores were mined here in the past. Along with the walled structures once owned by the mining administration a substantial part of local architecture is formed by houses of miners mostly built of logs on stone foundations. Both the stone or wooden walls were plastered with mud and painted with lime. The saddle roofs with gables were originally covered by shingles. The majority of preserved houses are from the 19th century. The tall tower of the church of Conversion of the Lord built on Romanesque foundations dominates the wonderful panorama. The entrance is situated in a little park with the Renaissance building of the former klopačka (knocker) from the 16th century. FLAG DAY FACTS HAPPY FLAG DAY!

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation declaring June 14

Flag Day. Congress followed the proclamation in 1949 by enacting



a statue that officially recognized Flag Day.

Flag Day commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States which occurred on June 14, 1777 by a resolution adopted by the Second Continental Congress. It also marks the birthday of the U.S. Army which congress authorized as "the American Continental Army" on June 14, 1775.

The flag always flies at the White House, Fort McHenry, and the Iwo Jima memorial.

There are still five American flags on the moon, but they are all probably bleached white due to radiation from the sun.

When two or more flags are flown on the same pole, the American flag must be at the top.

The colors of the flag have important meanings: red symbolizes hardiness and valor, white symbolizes purity and innocence, and blue represents vigilance, perseverance, and justice.





SS. CYRIL AND METHODIUS APPEAL OF THE SLOVAK CATHOLIC FEDERATION

The Saints Cyril and Methodius Appeal is in its 45th year raising money to assist the Pontifical Slovak College of Saints Cyril and Methodius in Rome with its day-to-day operations. V PAVLOVCIACH NAD UHOM OTVORILI MÚZEUM VYSŤAHOVALECTVA DO AMERIKY

Pavlovce nad Uhom 6. mája (TASR) - Múzeum vysťahovalectva z územia Slovenska do Severnej Ameriky v sobotu 6. mája slávnostne otvorili v obci Pavlovce nad Uhom v okrese Michalovce. Približuje emigráciu Slovákov najmä do Spojených štátov a ich tamojšie kultúrne aktivity.

"Múzeum mapuje spolkový život Slovákov a Rusínov v Amerike, máme 4000 artefaktov, ktoré svedčia o ich veľmi bohatom kultúrnom živote," uviedol zakladateľ múzea, historik Martin Javor. "Tretina národa sa nám vysťahovala bez akejkoľvek reflexie v slovenskej spoločnosti, to bol hlavný dôvod založenia. A druhým bolo, že slovenská menšina v Spojených štátoch končí, úplne sa asimilovala," doplnil s tým, že snahou bolo zachrániť kultúrne dedičstvo Slovákov v Amerike.

Prezentované artefakty sú z USA a Kanady, väčšina bola darom od krajanov, niečo sa podarilo kúpiť, vybaviť i zachrániť pred zánikom. Expozícia sa nachádza v zrekonštruovanom tzv. amerikánskom dome v miestnej časti Ťahyňa. "Je to dom postavený za peniaze zarobené v Amerike, my sme ho dali vyhlásiť za národnú kultúrnu pamiatku a podarilo sa nám ho zrekonštruovať presne, ako bol v roku 1892," priblížil Javor. Ťahyňa bola v minulosti samostatnou obcou, z ktorej sa takisto vysťahovali za more mnohí obyvatelia.

Súčasťou prezentácie je aj najväčšia zbierka stúh slovenských spolkov v Amerike, osobitná vitrína je venovaná bankárovi Michalovi Bosákovi, ktorý sa podpísal pod dolárovú bankovku. Vidieť napríklad aj uniformu amerického Slováka z československých légií z čias prvej svetovej vojny. "Financovali sme to z rôznych projektov a vlastných peňazí," uviedol zakladateľ múzea.

Vyše 4000 zbierkových predmetov podľa dočasne povereného ministra obrany Jaroslava Naďa vypovedá o časti histórie, ktorá doposiaľ nebola takto podrobne zmapovaná. "Ide o unikátne pamiatky a príbehy, ktoré sa s nimi spájajú," podotkol. Rezort obrany podporil projekt múzea prostredníctvom dotačnej schémy, a to v celkovej hodnote 40.000 eur.

Názov múzea Kasigarda je podľa historika slovenskou skomoleninou anglického Castle Garden, hlavnej brány imigračného úradu v New Yorku, ktorou musel prejsť každý imigrant. Expozícia je prístupná po telefonickej dohode. Poznámka redakcie - Medzi mnohými artekatami je znažná čast predmetov, plagátov a časopisov, ktoré múzeu daroval Slovenský katolícky sokol.

SLOVENSKO SA V REBRÍČKU SLOBODY TLAČE UMIESTNILO NA 17. MIESTE

Slovensko sa v celosvetovom rebríčku slobody tlače umiestnilo na 17. mieste. Od minulého roka si polepšilo o desať priečok. Aktuálny rebríček zverejnila medzinárodná organizácia Reportéri bez hraníc pri príležitosti stredajšieho Svetového dňa slobody tlače. TASR o tom informovalo Ministerstvo kultúry (MK) SR.

"Táto pozitívna správa je hmatateľným výsledkom domácej i medzinárodnej snahy o skvalitnenie mediálneho prostredia, ktorú Ministerstvo kultúry SR vyvíja v posledných rokoch. Zároveň je výbornou motiváciou, aby sme sa v nasledujúcich rokoch v rebríčku posúvali už iba vyššie," skonštatoval rezort.

Dočasne poverená ministerka kultúry Natália Milanová (OĽANO) poukázala, že snaha o zlepšenie mediálneho prostredia na Slovensku je prioritou celej vlády. "Ctíme si princípy demokracie a záleží nám na tom, aby žurnalistika na Slovensku bola objektívna a nezávislá a aby sa novinári a novinárky mohli cítiť bezpečne," podotkla.

Milanová sa stretne s predstaviteľmi organizácie Reportéri bez hraníc v Paríži v rámci svojej pracovnej cesty. Diskutovať tiež bude s francúzskou ministerkou kultúry Rimou Abdul Malak, s ktorou sa bude rozprávať o aktuálnom stave Európskeho aktu o slobode médií. European Media Freedom Act je momentálne jednou z prioritných tém Európskej únie v oblasti médií, ich slobody a nezávislosti.

Hnutie OĽANO pripomenulo, že ochranu novinárov má posilniť aj novela Trestného zákona, ktorá zavádza nový osobitný motív "pre výkon zamestnania, povolania alebo funkcie" a nový trestný čin "podnecovanie vzbudzujúce nenávist". Nová legislatíva by mala podľa hnutia odradiť každého, kto by sa chcel vyhrážať alebo inak útočiť na žurnalistov, ako aj ďalšie profesie, pre ich prácu.

Pandémia koronavírusu či vojna na Ukrajine podľa OĽANO ukazuje, aký významný je prístup občanov ku kvalitným a overeným informáciám, ktorý zabezpečujú etablované spravodajské médiá. "Poctivá žurnalistika je najlepšou vakcínou proti dezinformáciám, konšpiráciám, klamstvám, výmyslom. Aby bola účinná, okrem iného potrebuje aj prijateľné ekonomické podmienky. Aj na to myslí novela zákona o DPH, ktorá rozširuje zníženú daňovú sadzbu aj na služby predplatného pre online periodiká a spravodajské portály," doplnil poslanec Milan Potocký (OĽANO). Poslanci majú o novelách rokovať na aktuálnej májovej schôdzi parlamentu. - TASR

NEVYLIEVATE VODU, V KTOREJ STE VARILI ZEMIAKY

Voda, v ktorej sa varili zemiaky, je doslova nabitá prospešnými vitamínmi a minerálmi. Použite ju ako základ polievky, prihoďte do nej pár uvarených roztlačených zemiakov, ochuťte cesnakom a korením a jednoduchá cesnačka je na

svete. Rovnako z nej môže byť aj skvelá zeleninová polievka.

Keďže zemiaky sa zvyčajne varia v osolenej vode, neza-budnite to brať do úvahy, polievku priebežne ochutnávajte a dolejte čistú vriacu vodu podľa potreby.



Do vody sa pri varení zemia-

kov uvoľní aj veľa škrobu, vďaka jeho obsahu sa hodí aj na zahustenie omáčok či prívarkov. Aj tu platí že so soľou opatrne!

Pri odvodnení organizmu – Pitím zemiakovej vody podporíte hydratáciu organizmu. Prospejú vám minerály a sodík, ktoré táto voda obsahuje.

Na hojenie zápalov v ústach – Ak vás trápia zapálené ďasná alebo paradentóza, opäť môžete siahnuť po vode zo zemiakov. Stačí si ňou pravidelne preplachovať ústnu dutinu.

Na krásne vlasy – Neosolená voda zo zemiakov zlepší vašu pokožku hlavy a aj samotnú kvalitu vlasov. Oplachujte si ňou po umytí vlasy a budú krásne lesklé.

Zatočí s voškami – Pomocou rozprašovača aplikujte neosolenú vodu zo zemiakov na rastliny napadnuté voškami. Nezabudnite aj na spodné časti listov.

Aj surová šťava pomáha – Veľmi dobré účinky na zdravie má aj šťava zo surových zemiakov, ktorú môžete získať pri strúhaní zemiakov na halušky alebo placky. Pomáha pri liečení zápchy, proti páleniu záhy aj pri žalúdkových vredoch a zápaloch mandlí.

PREČO MÁME JESŤ JABLKÁ

Jablká obsahujú viac ako 25 minerálnych látok, najmä draslík, ktorý ovplyvňuje činnosť srdcovo-cievneho a nervového systému, horčík, ktorého deficit sa prejavuje vyčerpanosťou,



nervozitou, ďalej vápnik, ktorý je potrebný pri zrážaní krvi, pri stavbe kostí a zubov, pri svalovej činnosti, ale tiež napr. fosfor, síru či sodík.

Obsahujú aj pomerne dosť vitamínu C. Naiviac, až dve tretiny, sú v

šupke a tesne pod ňou, preto by sme jablká mali jesť celé. Navyše šupky obsahujú viaceré organické látky. Čaj zo sušených šupiek alebo z kvetov a listov jabloní sa odporúča pri neurózach, ochoreniach očí, poruchách trávenia, kolike či nadmernej žalúdočnej kyseline. Vitamín C zvyšuje obranyschopnosť, zlepšuje hojenie rán a zápalov, ale má aj tzv. antioxidačný efekt.

Významnou prednosťou jabĺk je obsah vlákniny, ktorá zlepšuje trávenie, podieľa sa na odstraňovaní mnohých odpadových látok, napr. aj škodlivého cholesterolu.

Viaceré enzýmy v nich majú podporné účinky na metabolické pochody. Kyselina jablčná, šťaveľová, citrónová, mliečna či jantárová napomáhajú tráveniu.

KRÁTKE SPRÁVY ZO SLOVENSKA



Ministerstvo obrany (MO) SR plánuje na leteckej základni Sliač vybudovať nové stojisko medzi rolovacími dráhami. Predpokladané náklady sú 6,5 milióna eur. Projekt má byť spolufinancovaný zo zdrojov NATO. Projekt sa má realizovať na základe potrieb NATO ako projekt programu bezpečnostných investicii NATO (NATO SecurityInvestmentProgramme NSIP). Stavba by sa mohla realizovať v období rokov 2023 -2024.

Na Slovensku, ktoré má 5,4 milióna obyvateľov, vlani zomrelo 59 583 ľudí. Medziročne to znamená pokles o 19 percent, išlo však o druhý najvyšší počet úmrtí od konca druhej svetovej vojny. V krajine zomrelo o 11 percent viac ľudí ako bol priemer za roky 2015 až 2019, keď krajina ešte nečelila epidémii choroby Covid-19, informoval Štatistický úrad. Počet zomretých bol druhý najvyšší od konca druhej svetovej vojny. Najväčšiu úmrtnosť zaznamenal Nitriansky kraj (1 245 zomretých na 100 000 tisíc obyvateľov). Horšia situácia ako v priemere na Slovensku bola aj v Banskobystrickom (1 213), Trenčianskom (1 204) a Trnavskom kraji (1 134), priblížila Orgoňová. Najnižšiu mieru úmrtnosti, naopak, evidovali Prešovský (960) a Bratislavský kraj (962).

Slovenská húfnica Zuzana 2, ktorú vyrába štátna akciová spoločnosť Konštrukta Defence, má šancu uspieť v zákazke pre brazílsku armádu. Na najväčší medzinárodný veľtrh obrany a bezpečnosti v Latinskej Amerike LAAD 2023 v Riu de Janeiro prišiel slovenský projekt podporiť aj poverený minister obrany Jaroslav Naď. Brazília by mohla kúpiť 36 kusov húfnic. Slovenský produkt konkuruje vojenskej technike z Francúzska, Číny či Izraela. Za jednu z výhod Zuzán jej reálne nasadenie v boji na Ukrajine. V prípade úspechu v súťaži by Brazília najprv obstarala dve húfnice. Po ich otestovaní by rozhodla o kúpe ďalších 34. Svoje kapacity navyšoval zbrojársky podniku už v súvislosti s vojnou na Ukrajine. Škultéty avizuje aj ďalšie investície. Brazílska armáda využíva technológiu zo Slovenska už teraz v podobe diaľkového detektora chemických látok. lde o jediný aktívny diaľkový detektor na svete. Až na šesť kilometrov dokáže zistiť a identifikovať chemické látky, ich koncentráciu na bojisku.

Ozbrojené sily SR prevzali už druhý tank Leopard 2A4, ktorý Slovensko dostalo od Nemecka ako náhradu za 30 kusov bojových vozidiel pechoty (BVP-1) darovaných Ukrajine. Prvý moderný tank Leopardov 2A4 nemeckej výroby si Slovensko prevzalo v decembri 2022. Ostatných 13 tankov majú dodať do konca roka. Tank prebrali v Nemecku príslušníci 14. tankového práporu Trebišov, 42. zásobovacej základne Martin OS SR a zástupcovia sekcie modernizácie rezortu obrany. Ako priblížil poverený minister obrany Jaroslav Naď, technika ešte pred odovzdaním prechádza komplexnou opravou v spoločnosti Rheinmetall Landsysteme. Prvý z dodaných tankov už prešiel aj skúškami na overenie vybraných takticko-technických parametrov vo Vojenskom technickom a skúšobnom ústave Záhorie. Pre zavedenie tankov do OS SR bude potrebné aj preškolenie posádok, ktoré v priestoroch Centra výcviku Lešť v lete tohto roka zabezpečia príslušníci Bundeswehru.
