

FROM THE DESK OF THE SUPREME SECRETARY SCOTT T. POGORELEC, F.I.C. MILESTONES



This week, we will celebrate the 247th anniversary of our nation's birth and I hope everyone has a wonderful Holiday with their friends and families. It is always important to look back and reflect on the history surrounding this special day. On July 2, 1776, the Continental Congress partook in a formal session to vote on the independence of our Nation. The rest of the day and the next were spent debating over the form and content of a declaration drafted by Thomas Jefferson. It sounds like a Convention, doesn't it? Several changes were made, and the final document was adopted on July 4, 1776. As President of the Congress, John Hancock was the first to sign and on July 8th, the Declaration was first read publicly in Philadelphia. By August 2, 1776, fifty members of Congress had signed the document and over the next several months, others followed suit. The Declaration of Independence is the most important document in our history and July 4th allows us the opportunity to celebrate and reflect on the meaning of this special document and the men who created it.

July 4th is also a special day for the Slovak Catholic Sokol. It was on that day in 1905 that 46 young Slovak immigrants gathered in Passaic, NJ and decided to form a new organization celebrating Sokol traditions. Just as our American Forefathers had, hope had to permeate through those meetings. Since they wanted to be patriotic Americans and were grateful to the United States for the opportunity to begin a new life, they selected the Fourth of July in 1905, the 129th anniversary of American independence, to enable their dreams to become real-

ity. In addition to our Sokol traditions of good sportsmanship and fraternalism, our organization also addressed the need to provide financial security for its members. On this year's Fourth of July, we will celebrate the 118th anniversary of our organization's founding. Many societies have been founded among various immigrant groups, but few have survived and prospered over the years. It is with immense pride that we continue to promote the high ideals of fraternalism which inspired our organization's founders 118 years ago. Generations of Sokol members have worked and promoted our great society and today we are financially sound and hope for your continued support.

In two weeks, our organization will be celebrating the 50th International Slet at Kutztown University in Kutztown, PA! This is truly an amazing feat for our society! This event is our organization's oldest and most revered sports gathering. I hope all our young people show the great sportsmanship that our founders promoted, and I hope all of them have an enjoyable and exciting SLET experience!

In one month, our Delegates will be meeting in Scranton, PA for our 34th Quadrennial Convention. Preparations have been made and we are in the final stretch of planning a wonderful event for our organization. FINAL SLET PREPARATIONS

WOW what an honor it will be for all of us to take part in the 50th International Slet (100 years anniversary). With few weeks to go to the International Slet and just over a decade we will be returning to the picturesque campus of Kutztown University in Kutztown PA.



Kutztown University is located half way between Allentown and Reading PA.

All the major plans have been finalized and the Physical Fitness board is continuing to work very hard behind the scenes to ensure that this year's Slet will be one of the best. The Supreme Physical Fitness Board will be arriving on Wednesday July 12th, for their meeting and to make sure that all is completed for the arrival of Slet participants.

The participants will arrive on Thursday July 13th. Registrations will take place in the courtyard of Dixon Hall starting at 8 a.m. All participants will stay in Dixon Hall.

This year's Slet once again will end with the departure on Sunday July 16.

Here are just a few helpful hints for making the final preparations necessary for a successful SLET.

Drillers, it is a good idea to practice your drills with your competition partner. Another good idea for drill practice is to do so in front of a mirror, this way you will see exactly what the judges will see on competition day. Commander and Commandress should be spending time reviewing all the drills, including the Mass Drill, with your drillers.

When practicing for track and field events, especially in hot and humid weather don't forget to replenish your body with plenty of fluids. Be sure to give your body the warm up and cool down times it desperately needs to function at its best without sustaining any injury.

Commander and Commandress are reminded to check the rules and regulations book for proper uniform descriptions. Be sure that your Drillers have the uniforms required for competitions. As you know, points are deduction for improper dress.

When packing be sure to include the following:

- a baseball cap or hat
- Adequate sunscreen (SPF 15 OR HIGHER IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED)
- at least one sweatshirt or sweater (in case the evenings are cool)

Linen set will be provided, feel free to bring along an extra pillow if you so desire. Dixon hall is air conditioned so you don't need to bring fans with you.

Please double check that you have all your uniform and sporting needs before closing your suitcase. Do not forget, as the rules and regulation book states, the **ONLY** advertising permitted on any clothing worn during the SLET is the Slovak Catholic Sokol logo.

A special reminder to Group leaders, please inform me of your means of transportation and approximate time of arrival

at Kutztown University. Be sure to allow ample traveling time so that you arrive at Kutztown University with enough time for registration and meeting. dusan.dorich022@sympatico.ca or by phone 416 806 4420.

Reminder to all the group leaders to bring with them and hand them in on registration all medical forms, consent & release forms.



A PRAYER FOR AMERICA BY JOHN CARROLL, FIRST U.S. BISHOP

Pope Pius VI named John Carroll the first bishop of the United States of America in 1789. His cousin, Charles



Carroll, was one of America's Founding Fathers and the only Catholic to sign the Declaration of Independence.

Bishop John Carroll would go on to become America's first archbishop when the Diocese of Baltimore, Maryland—the mother diocese of the United States—was elevated to the status of archdiocese.

Prayer for Our Government by Archbishop John Carroll (1791)

We pray, O almighty and eternal God, who through Jesus Christ has revealed thy glory to all nations, to preserve the works of your mercy, that your Church, being spread through the whole world, may continue with unchanging faith in the confession of your name.

We pray Thee, who alone are good and holy, to endow with heavenly knowledge, sincere zeal and sanctity of life, our chief bishop, the pope, the vicar of Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the government of his Church; our own bishop, all other bishops, prelates and pastors of the Church; and especially those who are appointed to exercise among us the functions of the holy ministry, and conduct your people into the ways of salvation.

We pray O God of might, wisdom and justice, through whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment decreed, assist with your Holy Spirit of counsel and fortitude the president of these United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness and be eminently useful to your people over whom he presides; by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in

justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality.

Let the light of your divine wisdom direct the deliberations of Congress and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government, so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety, and useful knowledge; and may perpetuate to us the blessing of equal liberty.

We pray for his excellency, the governor of this state, for the members of the assembly, for all judges, magistrates, and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare, that they may be enabled, by your powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability.

We recommend likewise, to your unbounded mercy, all our brethren and fellow citizens throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge and sanctified in the observance of your most holy law; that they may be preserved in union, and in that peace which the world cannot give; and after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal.

Finally, we pray to you, O Lord of mercy, to remember the souls of your servants departed, who are gone before us with the sign of faith and repose in the sleep of peace; the souls of our parents, relatives and friends; of those who, when living, were members of this congregation, and particularly of such as are lately deceased; of all benefactors who, by their donations or legacies to this Church, witnessed their zeal for the decency of divine worship and proved their claim to our grateful and charitable remembrance. To these, O Lord, and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we beseech you, a place of refreshment, light and everlasting peace, through the same Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior. Amen.

**SS. CYRIL AND METHODIUS APPEAL
OF THE SLOVAK CATHOLIC FEDERATION**

The Saints Cyril and Methodius Appeal is in its 45th year raising money to assist the Pontifical Slovak College of Saints Cyril and Methodius in Rome with its day-to-day operations. The Appeal relies upon the generosity of individual donors in addition to collections taken up in personal parishes of Slovak ancestry. A direct mailing asking for donations was sent in January to local district and branch leaders from the four Catholic Slovak Fraternal Organizations, members of the Slovak Catholic Federation, clergy with Slovak ancestry, and previous donors.

As of June 20, the 2023 Appeal has received \$22,228.51 from 171 donors. Among the 54 donations received from various Catholic Slovak Fraternal Branches and Districts, Assembly 23, Assembly 24, Assembly 34, Assembly 59, Assembly 71, Assembly 78, Assembly 82, Assembly 108, Assembly 162, Assembly 180, Group 4, Group 9, Group 12, Group 16, Group 17, Group 18, Wreath 14, Wreath 54, Wreath 93 as well as the Home Office of the Slovak Catholic Sokol have donated a combined total of \$1,955. Donations to date have also been received from 6 parishes, 27 clergy and religious, and 84 individuals. On behalf of the Pontifical College, thank you for your continued generosity and support.




He was an active member of Group 4 and Wreath 93.

Vyšľaháme vajička s kryštálovým a vanilkovým cukrom. Postupne pridáme mlieko, olej, múku a prášok do pečiva. Všetko dobre premiešame. Cesto vylejeme na vymastený a múkou vysypaný plech, môj mal 23x23 cm. Na vrch rozložíme jahody, menšie dáme celé a väčšie môžeme prepoliť. Upečieme vo vyhriatej rúre pri 180 stupňoch 25 minút. Hotovú bublaninu posypeme práškovým cukrom.

ŠALÁT Z GRILOVANEJ PAPIKY A BAKLAŽÁNU

3-4 červené papriky (kápie)
1 baklažán
hrst petržlenovej vňate
5-6 ks sušených paradajok
olivový olej
sol', čierne korenie
šťava z 1/2 citróna



Červenú papriku pripravíme tak, že ju v celku opečieme z každej strany. Môžeme ju opieť na grile alebo v rúre. Necháme ju poriadne upieť, až na niektorých miestach scerná. Ešte horúce papriky vložíme na chvíľu do sáčka, potom olúpeme z papriky kožu a nakrájame ich na tenké plátky. Medzitým si nakrájame baklažán na plátky a grilujeme z oboch strán. Alebo ho môžeme opieť v rúre pár minút z každej strany dohned. V mise zmiešame plátky baklažánu, nakrájanú papriku, sušené paradajky, nasekanú petržlenovú vňať, dochutíme soľou, korením, citrónovou šťavou a prelejeme olivovým olejom. Šalát môžeme podávať hneď, alebo nechať v chladničke odstáť. Podávame ku grilovanému mäsu.

ŠALÁT S BULGUROM (TABBOULEH)

100 g bulgur
100 ml citrónová šťava
10 ks lístky mäty
4 hrste petržlenová vňať
0.5 ks čerbená cibuľa
2 ks jarná cibuľka
2 ks stredne veľké paradajky
50 ml olivový olej
sol', mleté čierne korenie



Bulgur uvaríme v osolenej vode do mäčka, scedíme. Z citróna vytlačíme asi deci čerstvej šťavy a polovicu z nej premiešame s bulgurom. Necháme postáť a vychladíť. Medzitým si nasekáme petržlenovú vňať (aj s mladými stonkami) a lístky mäty nadrobno. Nadrobno nakrájame aj cibuľu a jarnú cibuľku zas na tenké kolieska. Paradajky pokrájame na maličké kúsky. Vo väčšej miske premiešame bylinky, cibule, paradajky a vychladený bulgur. Pridáme olej, zvyšok citrónovej šťavy, sol' a korenie podľa chuti a opäť premiešame. Šalát necháme postáť asi hodinu.

Ministerstvo zahraničných vecí a európskych záležitostí (MZVEZ) SR bude občanov SR žijúcich v zahraničí informovať o možnosti volby poštou priebežne počas leta. Pre TASR to potvrdil komunikačný odbor rezortu.

Informáciu plánuje rezort komunikovať prostredníctvom zastupiteľských úradov. Zdieľať ju chce aj cez sociálne siete na oficiálnych profiloch rezortu i jednotlivých zastupiteľských úradov. "Komunikácia je naplánovaná priebežne počas nadchádzajúcich letných mesiacov, s ohľadom na posledný možný termín registrácie občanov na voľbu poštou 9. augusta," ozrejmilo ministerstvo.

Volič, ktorý nemá trvalý pobyt na území Slovenskej republiky, môže voliť len poštou. Voľba poštou je určená aj pre voličov s trvalým pobytom na Slovensku, ktorí sa v čase volieb budú zdržiavať v cudzine. Žiadosť je možné podať elektronicky alebo listinne. – TASR

GYMNAZISTKY ZO SLOVENSKA VYHRALI MEDZINÁRODNÚ SÚŤAŽ V USA

Slovenskí mladí vedátori na medzinárodnej súťaži mladých vedátorov Genius Olympiad, ktorá sa uskutočnila v júni v USA, zaznamenali úspech. Študentky Gymnázia Jána Adama Raymana v Prešove Laura Kleinová a Natália Ivanecká získali zlatú medailu v kategórii veda za prezentáciu projektu "Odpudzujú bežné kozmetické produkty kliešte?".

Gymnazistky postúpili na medzinárodnú súťaž ako výherkyne národného finále Festivalu vedy a techniky AMAVET 2022. Vedeckým konzultantom ich projektu bol Branislav Peňko z Parazitologického ústavu Slovenskej akadémie vied. "Dievčatá na projekte po Festivale vedy a techniky kontinuálne ďalej pracovali a zlepšovali ho po obsahovej aj vizuálnej stránke. Zlatá medaila je skvelým zakončením ich tvrdej práce na projekte," zhrnul Michal Zajaček, ktorý slovenský tím AMAVET-u viedol na medzinárodnom podujatí.

Vo svojom projekte porovnávali repelentnosť bežných kozmetických produktov, najmä šampónov, respektíve sprchových gélov, parfumov a éterických olejov. V štúdiu, pri ktorej sa celkovo efekt študoval na vyše 1600 kliešťoch, zistili, že parfumsy a éterické oleje sú viac repelentné v porovnaní so šampónmi. Na základe analýzy vyhotovili aj svoj vlastný repelentný produkt, kokosový krém, ktorý kliešte výrazne odpudzuje, no súčasne je šetrný voči životnému prostrediu v porovnaní s bežnými syntetickými repelentmi.

Slovensko na podujatí reprezentovala aj Anna Pénzešová z Gymnázia sv. Mikuláša v Prešove, ktorá postúpila so svojím projektom o vplyve zmagnetizovanej vody na zvyšovanie znášky nosníčkov z biologickej olympiády. V rámci súťaže v USA získala čestné uznanie.

KRÁTKE SPRÁVY ZO SLOVENSKA



Vietnamská komunita sa stala 14. oficiálne uznanou národnostnou menšinou na Slovensku. Udelenie štatútu schválila vláda SR. Vietnamská menšina bude mať nárok na podporu svojich aktivít z finančných zdrojov Fondu na podporu kultúry národnostných menšín. V sčítaní obyvateľov, domov a bytov v roku 2021 sa k vietnamskej národnosti prihlásilo 2 793 obyvateľov SR. Vietnamskú národnosť ako ďalšiu národnosť si v Sčítaní obyvateľov, domov a bytov v roku 2021 uviedlo 489 obyvateľov SR.

K Česku a Poľsku sa pri zabezpečení ochrany slovenského vzdušného priestoru pripája Maďarsko. Ministri obrany alebo ich zástupcovia z krajín Vyšehradskej skupiny (V4) podpísali príslušnú deklaráciu, povedal novinárom slovenský minister obrany Martin Sklenár. Slovensko po tom, čo predčasne ukončilo prevádzku stíhačiek sovietskej konštrukcie MiG-29, sa v lete dohodlo s Českom a Poľskom na zabezpečení ochrany neba dotedy, kým Bratislava prevezme objednané americké stíhačky F-16. Prvé stroje by malo Slovensko v rámci meškajúcich dodávok dostať v budúcom roku.

Podľa Štatistického úradu inflácia v máji 2023 klesla na úroveň 11,9 percenta, čo boli hodnoty z apríla minulého roka. Stále sú to však vysoké hodnoty od začiatku milénia. Medzimesačne spotrebiteľské ceny tovarov a služieb dokonca klesli o 0,1 percenta, čo bolo prvýkrát od decembra 2020.

Slováci s kúpou bytu váhajú. Odborníci hovoria o 60-percentnom prepade dopytu. Štatistický úrad v poslednom kvartálnom zhodnotení zaznamenal útlm výstavby nových projektov. Kameňom úrazu je podľa analytika reálného trhu okrem sťažných podmienok v bankovom sektore aj ochladenie dopytu. Začiatok výstavby nových rezidiencií sa v prvom kvartáli podľa posledných údajov Štatistického úradu utlmil. Stavebné práce sa začali len na 3 681 bytoch.

Košické Silicon Valley rozšíri americký gigant. Vo februári vznikla spoločnosť Caterpillar Slovakia, ktorá sídli v Košiciach. Prednedávnom začala s náborem nových pracovníkov. Na východe Slovenska chce mať svoje výskumné stredisko, do ktorého plánuje lákať aj študentov z miestnej univerzity. V IT biznise sú Košice na Slovensku popredným hráčom. Kým vlni tam pôsobilo 50 významnejších firiem, dnes je to až 70. I

Slovenská centrálna banka vo svojej marcovej prognóze odhadla, že inflácia na Slovensku sa v tomto roku spomalí. Medziročná miera inflácie na Slovensku sa v máji spomalila na 11,9 percenta z aprílových 13,8 percenta, čo je najnižšia hodnota od apríla minulého roka. Tempo rastu spotrebiteľských cien sa spomalilo už tretí mesiac po sebe, keď vo februári dosiahlo 15,4 percenta. V máji ceny tovarov a služieb medzimesačne klesli o 0,1 percenta, čo bol prvý pokles od konca roka 2020, informoval dnes ČTK Štatistický úrad SR. V Českej republike sa medziročný rast spotrebiteľských cien v máji spomalil na 11,1 percenta z aprílových 12,7 percenta.
