Thoughts from our Supreme Chaplain, Rev. Andrew S. Hvozdovic

WHAT IS LENT?

Every religion has its own seasons in the same way that every generic calendar year does. If you take a look at the month of February, you'll stumble upon holidays such as Val-

entine's Day and US Presidents' Day.



However, these two examples are representative of global and government-related holidays. Another category of holidays is all about religious days of celebration. One of the most significant periods of time for followers of the Christian faith is a season known as Lent.

Religious Seasons 101: What is Lent?

So, we know that Lent is a time period that typically begins in February or March

(depending on the liturgical year). We've already touched on the fact that Lent holds a plethora of importance for followers of Christ. However, what exactly does Lent mean, and why is it so important to the various Christian denominations?

Well, to start with, the Lenten season is an incredibly historic and symbolic time for Christians. The religious season dates to Jesus Christ's life on earth. He lives forever in the hearts of his followers, but the Lenten season is a direct reflection of the days that eventually led up to his crucifixion. The day Jesus was nailed to the cross in Jerusalem is recognized as Good Friday in modern times.

Lent begins the day of Ash Wednesday, which is a religious day that is observed for the sake of recognizing our faults as human beings and taking the time to repent for the sins we have committed throughout our lifetimes.

Though not all Christians abstain from eating meat and drinking on Ash Wednesday, members of many denominations will participate in a full day of fasting once a week – typically on Fridays. In regard to the element of fasting, there is no hierarchy of devotion to one's religion or dedication to the season of Lent.

Just because one person decides to fast for the entire six weeks, that doesn't mean their faith is stronger or better than someone who doesn't restrict their intake. Fasting is simply an additional way of paying mind to one's deep repentance for prior sins, but the decision is optional, and more importantly, it's entirely personal.

In today's Christian community there are many iterations of fasting. Many people make a vow to fast from things such as negative thoughts, gossiping, social media binging shows on streaming sites, alcohol, and much more. New traditions also include adding things to your life for these 40 days such as setting aside time to meditate and pray each day, visiting shut-ins, and doing service.

Giving alms to the poor is another ancient tradition of the Lenten season. For many, the money they would have used for an item they are fasting from during Lent is collected and donated to the missions or a charity of your choice. For instance, if you usually drink a bottle of wine on the weekends and are fasting from that, the funds you would have spent on the wine you would donate. This act of charity adds a deeper meaning to the sacrifice you are making by fasting from something you enjoy.

- Be a 2022 high school graduate attending an accredited college, university, trade school, etc. in the summer/fall of 2022 as a full-time student (twelve semester credits).
- Obtain a recommendation letter from their Fraternal Benefit Society.
- Submit a 500-word essay on: "What has membership in a Fraternal insurance company meant to you".

Return the completed application, essay and letter of recommendation, postmarked no later than September 1, 2022.

At least two \$500 scholarships will be awarded. Additional scholarships may be awarded depending upon available funds. Judging will be done by the 2022 Scholarship Committee of the PFA. Awards will be announced at the Annual Meeting held in October 2022.

\$62.000 IN S.C.S. SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS AVAILABLE TO ELIGIBLE MEMBERS IN 2022

We are pleased to announce that the Slovak Catholic Sokol will make available a total of \$62,000 in scholarship grants to eligible members in 2022. Previous recipients of Slovak Catholic Sokol scholarship grants may reapply for a 2022



grant; however, per Convention mandate - a student may receive a maximum of two (2) Slovak Catholic Sokol scholarship grant awards and a maximum of one (1) in each of the other categories.

A total of 30 Slovak Catholic Sokol college grants of \$1,000 each, two Theodore and Mary Jane Rich Memorial Scholarships one for a male and female in the amount of \$2,000 each, two Emil Slavik Memorial Scholarships one for a male and female in the amount

of \$2,000 each, one The Doctors' Lesko Medical Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000, one Krista L. Glugosh Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000, one Yencha Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 and three Slovak Catholic Sokol (SCS) Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.

With one application you may apply for all college scholarship grants for which you are eligible. (Strongly recommended that you apply for numerous) Note that only one grant per applicant will be awarded.

College scholarship eligibility requirements:

SLOVAK CATHOLIC SOKOL (a total of 30, \$1,000 grants will be awarded)

- Must have a minimum of \$3,000 permanent Life Insurance Coverage
- Must be a member of the Slovak Catholic Sokol for at least five years.
- Must have completed one semester of undergraduate studies as a FULL TIME student at an accredited college, university or professional school, or be enrolled in a graduate or professional degree program.
- Must have an accumulated grade point average of at least 2.5 or better
- One parent must be a Slovak Catholic Sokol member
- Essay- "How has being a member of the Slovak Catholic Sokol influenced my life?"

THEODORE AND MARY JANE RICH (one male and one female grant in the amount of \$2,000 will be awarded)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND
- One parent must be of Slovak Ancestry
- Must be majoring in medical curriculum

EMIL SLAVIK (one male and one female grant in the amount of \$2,000 will be awarded)

 Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND

- Both parents must be members of the Slovak Catholic Sokol
- Must be majoring in liberal arts, the sciences, pre-law, pre-medical or business curriculum.

THE DOCTORS' LESKO MEDICAL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (1 grant in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND
- Majoring in Nursing or Medical curriculum
- One parent must be of Slovak Ancestry

KRISTA L. GLUGOSH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (1 grant in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND
- Majoring in curriculum with a focus in computer graphics, design or layout

YENCHA SCHOLARSHIP (1 grant in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship AND
- · Majoring in Liberal Arts Curriculum

SLOVAK CATHOLIC SOKOL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (3 grants in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded to the applicant that best exemplifies the spirit of volunteerism)

- Same requirements as for SCS scholarship
- Essay- "Describe the one volunteer experience that made the biggest personal impact on you- how/why".

SLOVAK CATHOLIC SOKOL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP-TIPS FOR SUCCESS

I just wanted to take a moment to highlight the recent changes made to the Slovak Catholic Sokol College Scholarship Program. We will continue to use a completely on-line process as we have had few issues with the process over the past several seasons. With the help of our technical webmaster, we have redesigned the application process and you should find it to be much more user friendly. You will find the on-line application on our website at www.slovakcatholicsokol. org beginning December 1, 2021.

To be best prepared for this process a successful applicant should:

- Review the application on-line for required content and gather prior to beginning to complete the form
- Be prepared to attach both your essay (in PDF or Word format) and a color head and shoulders picture of yourself (in .jpeg format).

Please note, you may want to print a copy for your records prior to submitting. All applicants will receive automatic confirmation that their e-mail has been received.

It really isn't that difficult to qualify for one of our many college scholarships. With now numerous years of the new College Scholarship Application process behind us, it is clear that there are a few ways to assure that your application will be reviewed.

1. ANSWER ALL QUESTIONS ON THE APPLICATION

For example- if something does not apply to you- say N/A. If you are fully independent from your parents-as in, you are not claimed by them on their tax return, you should indicate that in the space asking for total parent income. Leaving this blank does not tell the whole story.

INCLUDE ALL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE APPLICATION- I.E. PHOTO; TRANSCRIPT; ESSAY Start the process for requesting your transcript NOW. I have found that sometimes this is the hold up for some applicants.

Transcripts- please note that "official transcript"
means that you have requested it from your University
or College and that is has been sent directly to me in
a sealed envelope. We have not been as strict in the
past on this issue, but began holding each applicant to
this requirement last season and will continue to do so
moving forward.

3. SUBMIT ALL REQUIRED ELEMENTS PRIOR TO THE DEADLINE

The application is clear and I just want to prevent a waste of your time and energy. Failure to include/complete any of the above items will result in the application being disqualified. To be honest, it is not easy for our committee when we need to disqualify applicants for simple yet important missing requirements.

Lastly, apply for all college scholarships for which you qualify in order to give yourself the best chance at receiving

SLOVAKIA AND USA SIGN DEFENCE COOPERATION AGREEMENT

Slovakia and the USA signed the Defence Cooperation Agreement (DCA) in Washington on Thursday, February 3rd.

Defence Minister Jaroslav Nad signed the agreement on behalf of Slovakia, while Secretary of State Antony Blinken did so for the USA. The agreement is yet to be okayed by the Slovak Parliament and ratified by the Slovak president.

"The level of cooperation between Slovakia and the United States has been excellent for a long time. Defence cooperation with the United States has significantly contributed to the successful transformation and modernisation of the Slovak Army, especially the air force and the special operations force. We're giving a legal framework to this cooperation today. It's an expression of our joint commitment as NATO allies in relation to trans-Atlantic security," Defence Ministry spokesperson Martina Koval Kakascikova reported Nad as saying following the signing ceremony.

Slovak Foreign Affairs Minister Ivan Korcok was also present at the ceremony. "Strengthening defence cooperation with the main guarantor of our security, especially at a time of deepening uncertainties and geopolitical tensions, is a natural step for Slovakia. In addition, we should realise that we are the last country on the EU and NATO eastern border to do so," he said.

Blinken highlighted the agreement's benefits for the two countries before the ceremonial signing. At the same time, he objected to disinformation surrounding the agreement, stressing that the document is based on mutual cooperation and respect and represents the interests of both governments.

The agreement will enable US military forces to use Slovakia's Malacky-Kuchyna and Sliac military airbases and other facilities and premises as per agreement for a period of ten years. The Government representatives declared that the agreement doesn't endanger Slovakia's sovereignty. The opposition criticises the DCA, claiming that it will allow US military

bases to be set up, bring US troops closer to Russia's borders and curtail the powers of Slovakia's state authorities.

HOUSE GREENLIGHTS SLOVAK-US DCA

Parliament on Wednesday, February 9 approved the Defence Cooperation Agreement (DCA) with the USA. Of the 140 MPs present, the document was supported by 79, while 60 voted against.

The DCA is designed to allow the US Armed Forces to make use of Slovak military bases in Malacky-Kuchyna and Sliac and any other agreed facilities free of charge. The document should be valid for ten years. After this period, it could remain valid or be terminated with one year's notice.

According to Government representatives, the DCA is intended to strengthen military cooperation between Slovakia and the USA. Both Nad and Korcok declared that it fully respects Slovakia's sovereignty, denying that it would serve as a prerequisite for a permanent presence of the US Armed Forces on the territory of the country.

Meanwhile, the opposition has taken a critical approach towards the document, claiming that it allows US troops to close in on Russia's borders and limits the powers of Slovak authorities.

President Zuzana Caputova ratified the Slovak-US Defence Cooperation Agreement on Wednesday, February 9. In an attempt to dispel public concerns regarding the document, she made sure her authorisation for signing the document by the Government includes an interpretation clause that addresses parts of the agreement that raise questions. The Americans also drafted an interpretation clause of their own, which, according to the president, corresponds to its Slovak counterpart in terms of contents.

KORCOK AND NAD COMMEMORATED DIPLOMAT STEFAN OSUSKY

Slovak Foreign Affairs Minister Ivan Korcok honored the memory of prominent Slovak diplomat Stefan Osusky (1889-1973) in Washington, D.C. on Wednesday, February 2.

Korcok together with Defence Minister Jaroslav Nad laid flowers on Osusky's grave at the Oak Hill cemetery in Washington, D.C..

"For me, Stefan Osusky is a role model of a diplomat who worked hard and intelligently promoted the interests of his country abroad," stated Korcok. "Osusky understood the importance of relations with the Western allies for the establishment and maintenance of a free, independent and democratic country in Central Europe, and managed to develop and use them in an effective manner," added Korcok.

Stefan Osusky, as a co-author of the Cleveland Agreement, helped to shape the American concept of the post-war arrangement of Europe and, together with other compatriots in the USA, helped to fulfil the right of Slovaks and Czechs to self-determination. Subsequently, he sought to build a reputation for the young country as the Slovak ambassador in London and Paris. He, together with then foreign affairs minister Edvard Benes, took part in the diplomatic negotiations in Paris that resulted in signing of the Treaty of Trianon.

The ministers commemorated Osusky during their working trip to Washington, during which they are set to sign agreements deepening cooperation with the USA in the area of defence and development aid.

INFLATION SWELLED TO 3.2 PERCENT IN 2021, HIGHEST VALUE IN NINE YEARS

Yearly inflation in 2021 increased to 3.2 percent, the highest value in the past nine years, as a result of rapid growth in prices in the second half of the year

The Statistics Office noted that last year prices rose faster than the professional public expected. In 2020, under the influence of the pandemic, inflation reached only 1.9 percent.

"Developments during 2021 were turbulent, while in the first two months consumer prices rose by less than one percent, their growth rate gradually increased. From July, year-on-year price growth grew above three percent and in the last month of the year approached six percent," noted head of the price statistics department Stefan Adamec.

Last year, prices rose in all 12 main components of the consumer basket. Higher prices in transport had a significant effect, especially the growth of fuel prices – with an annual average by 17.3 percent. According to statisticians, this growth is also a consequence of the base effect, as fuel prices fell in 2020 and 2019. Rising prices of tobacco products after tax adjustments in March 2021 also had a significant impact, rising by 13.7 percent year-on-year.

FOUR COUNTRIES SUBMIT BIDS TO SUPPLY TRACKED VEHICLES FOR SLOVAK ARMY

Four countries have submitted bids to supply tracked vehicles to the Slovak army: Hungary, Sweden, Spain and Poland. The Defence Ministry invited 33 countries to submit bids within Slovakia's procurement of tracked vehicles.

The ministry plans to purchase 152 tracked vehicles in the first procurement stage.

According to the ministry, the Slovak army is currently equipped with tracked vehicles that are at the end of their technical lifespans. Their current service ability is 30 percent.

VLHOVA PULLS OFF MIRACULOUS SECOND RUN TO WIN GOLD IN SLALOM IN BEIJING

Slovak Alpine skier Petra Vlhova on Wednesday won the women's slalom event at the Winter Olympic Games in Beijing thanks to a phenomenal second run.



Vlhova finished first by the narrowest margin, beating Austria's Katharina Liensberger by only 0.08 seconds and Switzerland's Wendy Holdener by 0.12 seconds. Vlhova was back in eighth place after the first run ended, trailing by a considerable 0.72 seconds behind then-leader Lena Deurr of Germany.

The 26-year-old Slovak skier won her first-ever medal at the Olympics.

Moreover, she's also become the first Slovak to win any medal in Alpine skiing disciplines in Olympic competitions.

Vlhova has become only the fourth Slovak to win a medal at the Winter Olympic Games, joining the ranks of biathlete Anastasia Kuzmina (3 golds, 3 silvers), snowboarder Radoslav Zidek (1 silver) and biathlete Pavol Hurait (1 bronze).

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday marks the start of Lent and takes place 46 days before Easter. As the date of Easter is calculated on the cycles of the moon, the date of Ash Wednesday will vary from year to year. The earliest possible

date for Ash Wednesday is 4 February and the latest day is March 10.

DATE OF DEATH



Ash Wednesday is observed mainly by the Roman Catholic Church and also by some Protestant denominations such as Methodists, Episcopalians, Presbyterians and Lutherans.

The name of the day comes from the custom that churchgoers are marked on the forehead with a cross of ash to symbolise death and regret for past sins. The priest will accompany the marking with a recital of Genesis 3:19 - "Remember that you are dust, and

to dust, you shall return". The tradition of marking with ashes began in the early church as a way for persistent sinners to outwardly show their desire for repentance. By the end of the 10th century, the custom had spread to all the faithful.

Traditionally the ashes are created from burning the palms used in the church on Palm Sunday the previous year. Palm Sunday marked the arrival of Jesus into Jerusalem after his 40 days and nights in the desert.

During the 40 days before Easter, Roman Catholics are supposed to abstain from all bodily pleasures, including the consumption of meat. This is intended to remember the fasting of Jesus, who spent 40 days in the desert before beginning his ministry. In the Catholic Church, Lent gets off to an appropriate start with Ash Wednesday as it is a day of fasting, abstinence from meat and repentance.

100. VÝROČIE KONSEKRÁCIE KOSTOLA SVÄTÉHO MICHALA V TRENTONE, NJ

12. decembra 2021 oslávil Kostol svätého Michala v Trentone, NJ 100. výročie svojho vysvätenia. Bol postavený slovenskými imigrantmi v severnej časti mesta, kde sa slovenská komunita v tom čase rýchlo rozrastala.

11. decembra 1921 sa v ňom konala prvá svätá omša, počas ktorej ho posvätil vtedajší trentonský biskup Thomas Walsh.

V začiatkoch kostol nemal stáleho kňaza. Sväté omše tam slúžili slovenskí a poľskí kňazi z blízkeho okolia. Prvým stálym kňazom vo farnosti svätého Michala bol o. Michael J. Kallok (1926-1931). Za jeho pôsobenia bola v roku 1927 postavená spoločenská hala pod budovou kostola a o dva roky neskôr aj fara.

Plány rozrastajúcej sa slovenskej komunity boli dokonca oveľa odvážnejšie. Na mieste dnešného parkoviska mal stáť väčší, majestátnejší kostol a pôvodná budova kostola mala byť prerobená na katolícku školu. Veľká hospodárska kríza, ktorá prišla v roku 1929, všetky tieto plány zastavila.

Významnú rolu v histórii kostola zohral duchovný otec Ladislav Rakvica (1936-1972). Vo farnosti pôsobil ako farár 36 rokov a aj po odchode do dôchodku prichádzal ďalších 10 rokov do Kostola sv. Michala každú nedeľu, aby tu odslúžil slovenskú svätú omšu.

20. októbra 1939 začal v Kostole svätého Michala s novénami a pobožnosťami k svätému Júdovi ako poďakovanie za jeho zázračné uzdravenie z veľmi vážnej choroby. Prosby mnohých veriacich boli vypočuté na orodovanie svätého Júdu Tadeáša, ktorý je patrónom ľudí v beznádejných a zúfalých situáciách. Pobožnosť k sv. Júdovi v Kostole sv. Michala si počas rokov získala v širokom okolí Trentonu veľkú popularitu a aj dnes sa tu koná pobožnosť k sv. Júdovi každý štvrtok o 7.30 hod. večer ako aj slávnostná 9-dňová novéna každý rok od 20. do 28. októbra.

S odchodom duchovného otca Ladislava Rakvicu sa z kostola vytratil aj slovenský jazyk na dlhých 20 rokov.

Ďalšími kňazmi, ktorí tu pôsobili boli Otec William Capik (1972-1974), O. Louis Kralowich (1974-1982) a Msgr. James Innocenzi (1982-2005).

V roku 2002 pani Mária Kolcunová iniciovala obnovenie slovenských bohoslužieb v Kostole sv. Michala. Vtedajší trentonský biskup John Smith jej žiadosti vyhovel. Msgr. Innocenzi, farár vo farnosti sv. Michala, prijal slovenskú komunitu s otvorenou náručou.

Duchovným otcom pre Slovákov žijúcich v okolí Trentonu sa stal Otec Vladimír Chripko, ktorý prichádzal každú nedeľu a počas sviatkov vysluhovať slovenské sväté omše a sviatosti v slovenčine. Svojím obetavým prístupom k ľuďom stmeľoval slovenskú komunitu, ktorá pod jeho vedením rástla na duchovnom poli aj v počte svojich členov. Začalo sa s vyučovaním náboženstva v slovenskom jazyku. V rámci komunity sa konalo a stále koná mnoho kultúrno-spoločenských podujatí.

V roku 2005 farnosť sv. Michala zanikla a kostol sa stal súčasťou susednej farnosti sv. Anny v Lawrenceville, NJ. Otec Vladimír začal vysluhovať aj anglické sv. omše pre americkú komunitu, ktorá zostala v Kostole sv. Michala.

Kórejská katolícka komunita pribudla do kostola v roku 2006.

O. Vladimíra Chripka vystriedal vo vedení slovenskej komunity v roku 2015 O. Peter Bujdoš, ktorý pokračoval v podpore duchovných a spoločenských aktivít. V roku 2019 sa slovenská komunita pod jeho vedením zaviazala na 5 rokov finančne podporovať nevyhnutné opravy na budove kostola. Aj takto sa trentonskí Slováci snažia zachovať a udržať dedičstvo našich



predkov.

Oslavy storočnice kostola boli nádherným vyvrcholením viac ako polročnej prípravy, obetovaného času a námahy mnohých dobrovoľníkov z Kostola sv. Michala. Boh štedro požehnal tento slávnostný deň. Kostol bol zaplnený do posledného miesta. Svätú omšu celebroval trentonský biskup David O'Connell spolu s d'alšími 13 kňazmi a dvoma diakonmi. Aj Svätý Otec František poslal svoje apoštolské požehnanie. Čítania a prosby boli prednesené v jazykoch všetkých troch komunít Kostola sv. Michala; v anglickom, slovenskom a kórejskom.

Počas svätej omše zaspievali aj deti zo slovenskej komunity pieseň Vďaka Ti, Pane.

Pri príležitosti 100. výročia sa všetky tri komunity v kostole dohodli na inštalovaní mozaiky s vyobrazením Michala archanjela nad vstupné dvere do kostola. V závere slávnostnej sv. omše biskup David novú mozaiku požehnal.

Oslavy 100. výročia pokračovali po sv. omši v banketovej hale Ambassador v Trentone, na ktorej sa zúčastnilo viac ako 300 hostí. Oslavu spestrili krásnym kultúrnym programom deti zo slovenskej školy Pramienok, ktorá funguje pri Kostole sv. Michala.

V príjemnej atmosfére, o ktorú sa postaral Jaroslav Homola zo skupiny Relax sa ľudia zabávali až do neskorých večerných hodín.

Ďakujeme našim slovenským predkom za krásny Boží stánok, za to, že si našli čas, energiu a hlavne financie na výstavbu kostola. Z rodnej krajiny si so sebou priniesli nielen pracovitosť ale aj pevne zakorenenú vieru v Boha a presvedčenie, že s jeho pomocou si dokážu v novej krajine vybudovať život o akom snívali. Výstavba chrámu bol určite aj na vtedajšiu dobu odvážny zámer. Podarilo sa im však postaviť krásny útulný kostolík, ktorý až do dnešného dňa slúži svojmu účelu a aj po sto rokoch tu zaznieva ich rodná slovenská reč.

Aj dnes je Kostol sv. Michala v Trentone pre mohých Slovákov druhým domovom. Nachádzajú tu nielen duchovné posilnenie, možnosť pristupovať ku všetkým sviatostiam v slovenskom jazyku, ale aj príležitosť stretnúť sa s rodákmi na rôznych spoločenských akciách, zaspievať si, zatancovať, pomôcť si v núdzi, byť si navzájom oporou a udržiavať naše krásne ľudové tradície stále živé.

Slovenské sväté omše sa konajú v Kostole svätého Michala v Trentone každú nedeľu o 10.00 hodine dopoludnia.

PODMIENKY STRATY SLOVENSKÉHO OBČIANSTVA PRI NADOBUDNUTÍ CUDZIEHO SA ZMIERNIA

Podmienky, za ktorých dochádza ku strate štátneho občianstva, ak štátny občan Slovenskej republiky nadobudol cudzie štátne občianstvo, sa zmiernia. Vyplýva to z vládnej novely zákona o štátnom občianstve, ktorú schválili poslanci 16. februára.

Slovenskí občania neprídu o občianstvo SR, ak v čase nadobudnutia cudzieho občianstva mali v danom štáte povolený, registrovaný alebo inak evidovaný pobyt najmenej päť rokov a predložia o tom doklady.

Posilnia sa tiež právomoci rezortu vnútra pri kontrole splnenia podmienky pobytu na území cudzieho štátu. Ide o to, aby sa zamedzilo takzvaným fiktívnym pobytom.

Podľa schváleného návrhu Slovákom žijúcim v zahraničí, ktorí sa významne zaslúžili o prínos pre komunitu Slovákov žijúcich v zahraničí a ktorí majú na území SR povolený pobyt, možno udeliť štátne občianstvo aj bez trojročného nepretržitého pobytu na území SR.

Slovenské občianstvo budú môcť jednoduchšie nadobudnúť aj osoby so slovenským pôvodom, ak jeden z rodičov, prarodičov alebo praprarodičov bol československým štátnym občanom narodeným na Slovensku.

Z dôvodu príbuznosti českého jazyka, ktorý spĺňa požiadavku základnej zrozumiteľnosti, sa u žiadateľov, ktorí sú alebo boli štátnymi občanmi Českej republiky, uplatňuje výnimka z požiadavky ovládania slovenského jazyka.

Výnimka platí tiež pre žiadateľov starších ako 65 rokov a žiadateľov, ktorí vykonali jazykové skúšky zo slovenského jazyka. Tieto výnimky sa uplatňujú aj u žiadateľov, ktorí majú platné osvedčenie preukazujúce postavenia Slováka žijúceho v zahraničí.

O slovenský pas prichádzajú ľudia, ktorí prijali občianstvo iného štátu na základe zákona prijatého za vlády Roberta Fica v roku 2010. Vtedajšia vláda tak reagovala na maďarský zákon. Ten zjednodušil udeľovanie občianstva zahraničným Maďarom.

V roku 2015 prijalo Ministerstvo vnútra SR nariadenie, ktoré umožňuje bývalým občanom požiadať naspäť o slovenské občianstvo na základe výnimky ministra vnútra. - SITA

VIETE, ŽE...

...slávny režisér, producent a scenárista Ivan Reitman, ktorý zomrel 12. februára vo veku 75 rokov, sa narodil v Komárne? Bol režisérom niekoľkých hitov, ktoré poznal celý svet – Krotitelia duchov (1984), Dvojičky (1988), Policajt zo škôlky (1990), Dave (1993), Junior (1994), Šesť dní, sedem nocí (1998), neskôr to boli filmy Hlavne nezáväzne (2011) či Lietam v tom (2009). Ivan Reitman sa narodil 27. októbra 1946 v Komárne vo vtedajšom Československu. Jeho rodičia boli židovského pôvodu. Matku počas druhej svetovej vojny odvliekli do koncentračného tábora Osvienčim, otec pôsobil v domácom odboji. Rodina v roku 1951 z Československa emigrovala za príbuznými do Kanady. Reitman vyrastal v Toronte. Ako režisér sa presadil v 80. a 90. rokoch. Jeho najvýznamenjší úspech mu priniesol film Krotitelia duchov (Ghost Busters) z roku 1984, ktorý zarobil celosvetovo takmer 300 miliónov dolárov a získal dve nominácie na Oskara.

Vo veku 82 rokov zomrel v stredu 9. februára bývalý minister zahraničných vecí, poslanec Národnej rady SR a Európskeho



parlamentu Eduard Kukan. Pôsobil vo viacerých funkciách na československých veľvyslanectvách v Lusake (Zambia, 1968 - 1973), vo Washingtone (USA, 1977 - 1981), Addis Abebe (Etiópia, 1985 - 1988). V roku 1990 bol vymenovaný za veľvyslanca - stáleho predstaviteľa ČSFR (Česká a Slovenská Federatívna Repub-

lika) pri OSN v New Yorku (1990 - 1993). Po vzniku samostatnej Slovenskej republiky ju v rokoch 1993 - 1994 zastupoval ako veľvyslanec - stály predstaviteľ pri OSN. Na 48. Valnom zhromaždení OSN ho zvolili za predsedu Výboru pre humanitné, sociálne a kultúrne záležitosti. V roku 1993 získal čestný doktorát na Upsala College v New Jersey. Bol tiež držiteľom titulu doktor honoris causa z Petrohradskej štátnej univerzity a členom výboru poradcov v Global Panel Fundation.

Pandémia v SR skrátila strednú dĺžku života. Nárast počtu zomretých v roku 2021, ktorý je možné vidieť z predbežných údajov Štatistického úradu SR, sa s najväčšou pravdepodobnosťou odzrkadlí v ďalšom skrátení strednej dĺžky života u oboch pohlaví. Kým v predpandemickom období zomieralo na Slovensku ročne v priemere 51 000 až 54 000 osôb, v prvom roku pandémie stúpol tento počet na necelých 60 000. V roku 2021 umrelo dokonca viac ako 72 000 osôb, čo v relatívnom vyjadrení predstavuje približne 13 úmrtí na 1000 obyvateľov.

Zamestnanosť na Slovensku v roku 2021 medziročne klesala naprieč celou ekonomikou, výnimkou boli informačné a komunikačné činnosti, ktoré zvýšili pracovné kapacity o 4,8 percenta v porovnaní s rokom 2020. Bol to zároveň jediný sektor, ktorý prijal viac zamestnancov aj v porovnaní s obdobím spred pandémie nového koronavírusu. Medziročne vzrástla zamestnanosť aj vo vybraných trhových službách, a to o 0,2 percenta. V ostatných ôsmich sledovaných odvetviach bol zaznamenaný pokles zamestnanosti od 1,5 percenta v doprave a skladovaní a 9,2 percenta v ubytovaní.

**** ** ** ***

Na medzinárodné vojenské cvičenie vo výcvikovom priestore Lešť a na letisku Sliač, ktorétrvá od 1. do 14 marca, sa zúčastňuje približne dvetisíc amerických vojakov. Po takmer dvoch rokoch plánovania, za účasti ozbrojených síl 13 krajín, sú slovenskí vojaci pripravení na prijatie cvičiacej spojeneckej jednotky. Cieľom je preveriť spoločnú pripravenosť na rýchle a efektívne presuny spojeneckých jednotiek v zimných podmienkach, vedenie obranných operácií a ich komplexná logistická podpora.
