EASTER JOY FOR EVERYDAY LIFE

More than just a day, the Church gives us a sevenweek Easter season to celebrate. Yet sometimes our everyday lives feel so heavy that celebration is not a part of them. Critical illness in the family, loss of a job, dis-



appointment in a relationship and the burdens of everyday life can make it a challenge to feel particularly joyful – even in the Easter season.

But the joy we are being invited into this season is beyond what we see in our everyday lives. It's true that Jesus says "Come to me and bring me your burdens" but we usually can't believe it. Maybe we don't want to

believe it. If I really allow Jesus to come into my heart the way he wants to, will he ask me to change my life in ways that are too hard? How do I share the chaos of my life with Jesus? If I keep him at arm's length, my life might be difficult, but at least my problems are familiar. What would it cost me to let go and change my life?

We know our own faults and failings so well. Too well. We begin to believe that Jesus loves the way we love – with all of our human limits. How could Jesus love us and accept us the way we are right now? Maybe when we fix a few things about our lives, love our spouse a little better, stop being so critical of family members, stop drinking, stop nagging, love a little more... when we are perfect, then Jesus will love us.

If we can overcome our fears, the real power of letting Jesus into our hearts is how free our hearts will become. Suddenly, we are not afraid, not burdened and simply ready to serve with Jesus.

Jesus loves us - right now. At this moment, Jesus holds each one of us in his warm and loving gaze and loves us so freely at a depth that our human minds can't take in. Whether we comprehend this or not, Jesus loves us endlessly and waits for us with his arms open, ready to hold and support us.

Team Event... The format will again be 4-Bowler Teams (Mens & Womens Only-No Mixed Teams), and team members may combine and send only one application if all fees are included. If bowlers are unable to fill all 4 positions on a team, we will assist you.

Additional Actual Prize Money... In an effort to increase participation from higher average bowlers, the GCU Board of Directors has again pledged an additional \$1,000.00 to be used to pay actual score prizes across all tournament events. This will not have any affect on the handicap prizes which will continue to be paid as in the past.

Squad Time Assignments... There will be only one squad time for both the team event. Team bowling will take place on **Friday, May 17 at 6:30 PM**. The doubles & singles squads are scheduled for **Saturday, May 18 at 9 AM AND 12:30 PM**. If there are less than 120 bowlers enter in the Singles and Doubles events, there will only be one squad bowled at 10 AM.

Friday Evening Hospitality... All bowlers (and pre-paid guests) are welcome to join in for food and fraternalism on Friday, May 17. The hospitality buffet will be served at Bowlero Pittsburgh Lanes beginning at 5 PM.

Saturday Evening Bowlers' Cocktail Reception... In the interest of fraternal camaraderie and to celebrate the GCU, NSS & SCS Combined National Bowling Tournament, a reception for bowlers and their guests will take place on Saturday evening May 18 at 5:30 PM at the DoubleTree Hilton Greentree Hotel. Important to All Tournament Entrants Read Carefully Information Given Below Rules and Regulations of Annual Slovak Catholic Sokol Bowling Tournament

The purpose and aim of our organization in sponsoring annual bowling championships is to promote good sportsmanship, fraternalism and national interest in the Slovak Catholic Sokol.

As you know, each year the Supreme Assembly, recognizing the great importance of bowling in our organization, donates 60.00 to the prize fund for each team entry entered in the International Tournament. This financial contribution on the part of our organization is added to the regular prize fee collected by the bowlers. All prize fees collected will be refunded 100% in prizes.

In order to successfully operate our tournaments, we must have cooperation and exact adherence to all entry rules and regulations which govern teams and individuals.

Please read these rules carefully. Do not overlook any detail. Comply with all requests at time entry blank is being filled out and when sending it in with the proper money order, certified check or check. Be sure you have the bowlers affidavits as of all sanctioned league averages for 21 games or more in accordance with our rules governing averages. This will speed up the mailing of prizes after results have been checked. Remember that false information will result in forfeiture of all rights to prizes.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Slovak Catholic Sokol Championship Tournament is open to all members of our organization, both male and female (no juniors) who are in good standing and have been members for at least (3) three months SPL or (1) one year for all other policies, prior to the date of tournament with a minimum of \$3,000.00 coverage. Policy Holders no Social Members. As mandated by the 2007 Convention, all new members enrolled after January 1, 2008 will require a new minimum of \$5,000.00 of insurance coverage to participate in the programs after January 1, 2020.
- 2a. All members of the competing teams must be members of the same Assembly or Wreath. There is no limit to the number of teams from each Assembly or Wreath.
- 2b. An Assembly or Wreath not having enough bowlers to make up a team may combine with another Assembly or Wreath to make up a team.
- 3. Doubles teams may be from any Assembly or Wreath for both Men and Women Divisions.
- 4. All participants must be certified by the respective Assembly or Wreath Financial Secretary and may enter only once for each division.
- 5. High Score recognition automatically extended to USBC members. Eligible nonmembers can qualify for high score recognition at their option by paying a \$5.00 participation fee. Affiliated membership is \$21.00.
- 6. There will be at least one prize for each (10) ten entries in each event, and each (20) twenty entries for All-Events for Men and Women.
- 7. All-Events (optional), shall be handicap. This prize fund is a separate entry (\$5.00) and no tournament expense fee is assessed for this. Only those entrants paying this fee are eligible. Please indicate All-Events entries by placing an "X" before names in Team Entry space on Entry Form side.
- 8. Prize fee will be \$10.00 per bowler per event. Cost of bowling and tournament expenses \$13.00 per bowler per event. Total = \$23.00 per event.
 - 9. No entry money will be returned for any reason.
- 10. The United States Bowling Congress rules and regulations apply to all bowlers.
- 11. The Championship in both Men's and Women's Divisions will receive individual championship shirts. In the event of a tie for championship, lowest team handicap will receive shirts, cash prizes will be divided equally.

12a. Handicap (Men) allowed will be 85% of the difference between 240 and last season's 2022-2023 highest sanctioned league average of at least 21 games. Bowlers who have no established average will use their highest sanctioned league average of at least 21 games as of January 1, 2024. A male bowler whose current average of 21 games or more at time of entry is (10) pins or more higher than the previous season's average must use his current average. Male bowlers who have no established average for this year or last year will be listed as 175 average and will be handicapped accordingly. If the bowler does not have a sanctioned average over the last two years, but has competed in the Joint Fraternal Tournament, the most recent 5 year history of Joint Fraternal Tournaments will be used. If none of the above apply, the average of 175 for men will be used. Male bowlers with an average over 240 will receive no handicap and will bowl scratch in the tournament.

12b. All participants will be governed by rerating requirements of USBC Rule 319e. Average to be adjusted accordingly. Failure to use the current average shall disqualify score if submitted average is lower than correct average thereby resulting in a lower classification of more handicap. Prize winnings shall be based on the submitted average if it is higher. However corrections in averages may be permitted up to the completion of the first game of a series.

12c. Handicap (Women) allowed will be 85% of the difference between 200 and last season's 2022-2023 highest sanctioned league average of at least 21 games. Bowlers who have no established average will use their highest sanctioned league average of at least 21 games as of January 1, 2024. A female bowler whose current average of 21 games or more at time of entry is (10) pins or more higher than the previous season's average must use her current average. Female bowlers who have no established average for this year or last year will be listed as 150 average and will be handicapped accordingly. If the bowler does not have a sanctioned average over the last two years, but has competed in the Joint Fraternal Tournament, the most recent 5 year history of Joint Fraternal Tournaments will be used. If none of the above apply, the average of 150 for women will be used. Female bowlers with an average over 200 will receive no handicap and will bowl scratch in the tournament.

- 13. Teams wishing to bowl all nine games as Team, Double and Singles in one day or a specific day or time must submit that request at time of entry. (Only if necessary)
- 14. List team names in order of lineup to bowl. The USBC substitute rule will be used in the event it is necessary. Average certification must accompany entry form.
- 15. All teams must bowl according to the published schedule. In order to ensure your choice of schedule time, send entries in early.
- 16. Bowlers have 48 hours from completion of tournament to notify manager of error in score. Bowlers must include a copy of their league average sheet with their application.
- 17. Every consideration will be granted to request date/time preferences for out-of-town teams and individual bowlers. The success of the tournament depends upon all participants.
- 19. Bowlers need not report information as required by USBC (Rule 319d provision) for tournament prize winnings.

SLOVAK CATHOLIC SOKOL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP-TIPS FOR SUCCESS

I just wanted to take a moment to highlight the recent changes made to the Slovak Catholic College Scholarship Program. We will continue to use a completely on-line process as we have had few issues with the process over the past several seasons. With the help of our technical webmaster, we have redesigned the application process and you should find it to be much more user friendly. You will find the on-line application on our website at www.slovakcatholicsokol.org beginning December 1, 2023.

To be best prepared for this process a successful applicant should:

- Review the application on-line for required content and gather prior to beginning to complete the form
- Be prepared to attach both your essay (in PDF or Word format) and a color head and shoulders picture of yourself (in .jpeg format).

Please note, you may want to print a copy for your records prior to submitting. All applicants will receive automatic confirmation that their e-mail has been received.

It really isn't that difficult to qualify for one of our many college scholarships. With now numerous years of the new College Scholarship Application process behind us, it is clear that there are a few ways to assure that your application will be reviewed.

1. ANSWER ALL QUESTIONS ON THE APPLICATION

For example- if something does not apply to you- say N/A. If you are fully independent from your parents-as in, you are not claimed by them on their tax return, you should indicate that in the space asking for total parent income. Leaving this blank does not tell the whole story.

- INCLUDE ALL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE APPLICATION- I.E. PHOTO; TRANSCRIPT; ESSAY Start the process for requesting your transcript NOW. I have found that sometimes this is the hold up for some applicants.
 - Transcripts- please note that "official transcript"
 means that you have requested it from your University
 or College and that is has been sent directly to me in
 a sealed envelope. We have not been as strict in the
 past on this issue, but began holding each applicant to
 this requirement last season and will continue to do so
 moving forward.

3. SUBMIT ALL REQUIRED ELEMENTS PRIOR TO THE DEADLINE

The application is clear and I just want to prevent a waste of your time and energy. Failure to include/complete any of the above items will result in the application being disqualified. To be honest, it is not easy for our committee when we need to disqualify applicants for simple yet important missing requirements.

Lastly, apply for all college scholarships for which you qualify in order to give yourself the best chance at receiving something. There were several applicants who limited themselves to a particular scholarship. Competition was fierce for the larger \$ scholarships, but there seems to be more opportunity with the other scholarship offerings.

Not every applicant receives a scholarship every time they apply. If you have not received one in the past, I encourage you to apply again this year. Before submitting your application- take some time to review the bullet points above in order to assure that your application will be included for consideration.







Konzorcium európskych tlačových agentúr, ktorého súčasťou je aj Tlačová agentúra Slovenskej republiky (TASR), získalo od Európskej komisie finančnú podporu pre svoj projekt European Newsroom (ENR/Európske pracovisko pre novinárov) na ďalšie dva roky. MANDLE SŰ VYNIKAJÚCIM ZDROJOM VIACERÝCH VITAMÍNOV A MINERÁLOV



JEDEN POMARANČ POKRYJETE DENNÚ DÁVKU VITAMÍNU C

Pomaranče sú výborným zdrojom vitamínu C, čím zvyšujú našu odolnosť voči infekciám. Stačí, ak denne skonzumujete jeden väčší pomaranč

(200 gramov) a máte pokrytú odporúčanú dennú dávku tohto vitamínu.

Pomaranče sú jedným z najvýdatnejších zdrojov stopového prvku selénu, ktorý sa tiež účastní na zacho-



čo znamená, že rozkladajú tukové "vankúšiky".

Konzumáciou pomarančov možno tiež predchádzať tvorbe obličkových kameňov. Ďalej podporujú trávenie a vstrebávanie živín, najmä železa. Chránia cievy, udržiavajú ich pružné a priechodné, pôsobia ako prevencia rakoviny a mnohých chronických ochorení.

Pomaranče pomôžu udržať pokožku sviežu a znižujú príznaky starnutia. Sú z veľkej časti tvorené vodou, telu teda doplnia i tekutiny. Vôňa pomarančov má vplyv aj na naše duševné zdravie, zmierňujú stres a podráždenosť, pôsobia antidepresívne.

KRÁTKE SPRÁVY ZO SLOVENSKA



V januári zbankrotovalo 616 občanov Slovenska. medziročnom porovnaní s rovnakým obdobím minulého roka so 448 osobnými bankrotmi to predstavuje nárast o 37,5 percenta. Vyplýva to z analýzy spoločnosti CRIF - Slovak Credit Bureau, ktorá spravuje úverové registre bankových i nebankových inštitúcií. Z celkového počtu 616 bankrotov ich bolo 55 vyhlásených na majetok fyzických osôb - podnikateľov a 561 na majetok nepodnikateľov. Súdy zároveň zrušili 853 konkurzov, ktoré boli vyhlásené v predchádzajúcich obdobiach. Z nich bolo 762 zrušených pre nedostatok majetku dlžníka a 91 konkurzov bolo zrušených po splnení konečného rozvrhu výťažku. V bankrotoch stále viacej prevažujú muži. V januári ich zbankrotovalo 407, pričom žien 209. Najviac bankrotov bolo vyhlásených v Bratislavskom (121) a v Prešovskom kraji (121), najmenej v Nitrianskom kraji (51). Od roku 2006, keď na Slovensku začal platiť inštitút osobného bankrotu, do konca januára bolo podľa podľa CRIF vyhlásených 78.053 osobných bankrotov.

Český expremiér Andrej Babiš neuspel so sťažnosťou na Ústavnom súde (ÚS) SR v kauze jeho evidencie vo zväzkoch komunistickej Štátnej bezpečnosti (ŠtB). Namietal rozsudok Krajského súdu v Bratislave a uznesenie Najvyššieho súdu SR, ÚS však jeho ústavnú sťažnosť odmietol. Senát ÚS vo veci rozhodol na nevereinom zasadnutí 1. februára.Bratislavský krajský súd v júni 2022 zamietol Babišovu žalobu podanú voči Ústavu pamäti národa (ÚPN). NS vlani v auguste dovolanie podané českým expremiérom odmietol. Babiš bol vo zväzkoch ŠtB vedený ako agent pod krycím menom Bureš, sám však spoluprácu s ŠtB popiera a trvá na tom, že je vo zväzkoch vedený neoprávnene. V spore o ochranu osobnosti podal žalobu na ÚPN ešte v roku 2012. V kauze rozhodovali súdy už viackrát. Vo februári 2018 bratislavský krajský súd žalobu českého premiéra zamietol a NS SR následne odmietol Babišom podané dovolanie. Vo veci sa opätovne muselo konať po tom, ako ÚS SR v novembri 2018 zrušil rozhodnutia krajského a najvyššieho súdu. V roku 2022 bratislavský krajský súd skonštatoval, že pasívne vecne legitimovaným subjektom je Slovenská republika v zastúpení Ministerstva vnútra SR, nie žalovaný ÚPN.

Ázijského komára tigrovaného zaznamenali na Slovensku. Ide o jeden z najnebezpečnejších inváznych druhov komára, ktorý prenáša až 22 druhov vírusov, ako je západonílsky vírus, alebo žltá zimnica. Výskyt komára potvrdilo Biomedicínske centrum Slovenskej akadémie vied.

V Prezidentskom paláci sa 20. februára uskutočnil tradičný obed hlavy štátu Zuzany Čaputovej s bývalými prezidentmi SR Rudolfom Schusterom, Ivanom Gašparovičom a Andrejom Kiskom. Čaputová verí, že nová hlava štátu si túto tradíciu zachová. "Som veľmi rada, že sa nám podarilo stretnúť. Nadviazala som tým na tradíciu, ktorú založil prezident Kiska. Je to príjemná chvíľa každý rok," povedala médiám Čaputová po skončení obeda.
